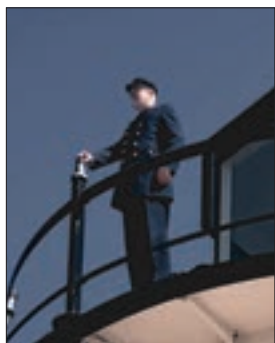

District 9 special election set for Oct. 17

LUNENBURG - People living in District 9 of the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg (MODL) will vote this fall to choose a new councillor, following the resignation of Ben Brooks.

MODL has scheduled Saturday, Oct. 17, for the special election to fill the empty council seat. Brooks' resignation became official on July 14, after he spent nearly two years representing the district.

During a special meeting on Aug. 4, MODL council approved the election timeline and administrative steps required under Nova Scotia's Municipal Elections Act.

Voters will have the option to cast their ballots electronically, either online or by phone. The municipality noted that electronic voting has worked well in earlier municipal elections and is meant to make voting easier and more accessible for those eligible.

Important dates for the election are Sept. 22 for Nomination Day, Oct. 8 for advance voting, and Oct. 17 for the regular polling day.

April Whynot-Lohnes, MODL's municipal clerk, has been named returning officer for the election. The chief administrative officer has also been given the power to appoint an Assistant Returning Officer if needed.

This vacancy comes after Brooks decided to step down from council, saying he no longer felt he could truly represent District 9 within the current municipal system.

In an interview with the South Shore Bulletin after his resignation, Brooks called the municipal system "fundamentally broken" and said his decision was not caused by any single disagreement or event.

Brooks said he first ran for office because he thought local government could make a bigger difference at the grassroots level and offer stronger representation for residents, businesses, and community groups.

However, after almost two years on council, he said he grew more frustrated with what he saw as the limits of municipal authority. He argued that municipalities spend much of their time carrying out provincial requirements, applying for grants, and following policies made outside the local area.

Brooks said he eventually felt that staying in office would mean continuing to take part in a system he no longer trusted.

He also said his resignation would not stop him from being involved in public advocacy. Brooks said he plans to keep pushing for more local authority, economic growth, accountability, and changes to how municipal government is organized on the South Shore.

Since his resignation, Deputy Mayor Cha-

sidy Veinotte has been representing District 9 until a special election could be held.

Mayor Elspeth McLean-Wile earlier thanked Brooks for his work and said council would focus on supporting District 9 residents during the transition and election period.

"Strong local government depends on community participation," McLean-Wile said in the municipality's election announcement. "This special election provides District 9 residents with an opportunity to choose who will represent their interests at the Council table."

Anyone interested in running for the seat must submit nomination papers by Sept. 22. Details about who can run, nomination steps, voting methods, and deadlines will be shared through the municipality's Engage MODL platform.

MODL will also use news releases, social media, ads, and other public channels to share election updates.

The municipality estimates the special election will cost about \$23,000. This expense will be covered by MODL's Election Reserve and will not impact the municipality's 2026-27 operating budget.

Election details, including who can vote, how to vote electronically, candidate information, and frequently asked questions, will be available through Engage MODL as the election gets closer.

Ontario tourist raises concerns over stay at Bridgewater Hotel

SOUTH SHORE - An Ontario tourist says a one-night stay at the Bridgewater Hotel in Bridgewater left her very dissatisfied with the state of her room and worried she may have been exposed to bed bugs.

Kaye Larocque said she and her family arrived at the hotel at about 11:30 p.m. on Thursday, Aug. 13, after waiting for a bus to arrive. Staff directed them to park around the corner and use a specific entrance to get to their room.

Larocque said the area near the entrance made her uneasy, describing people smoking out of windows and two men sitting at a table in the dark, drinking alcohol.

“Right off, you got kind of a weird feeling,” she said.

The state of the room added to her worries. Larocque said there was sand and gravel on the floor, along with children’s Lego pieces, which made her think the room had not been vacuumed.

She also said the bathroom was dirty.

Larocque said she went downstairs to look for someone who could help her change rooms, but could not find anyone. She also mentioned she had no cellphone service at the hotel and

had to use her son’s hotspot.

With no immediate alternative, the family stayed for the night. Larocque said she cleaned the toilet herself, nobody showered, and the family slept on top of the bed covers.

The next morning, Larocque said she woke up with itching on one side of her body. She went back to the lobby around 8 a.m. and asked if they could move to another room.

According to Larocque, a staff member told her they had only booked for one night and that the other available rooms had not yet been cleaned.

“I said, ‘Well, ours wasn’t cleaned either,’” she said.

The family left the hotel instead of staying for the second day of their planned trip. Larocque said they had planned to visit a local museum and walk a nearby trail, but she was so upset by the experience that they just got in the car and eventually ended up in Mahone Bay.

After returning to Ontario, Larocque said she tried to contact the hotel several times. She said she was given different names and contact information but did not get a response to her calls or email.

She also said the skin irritation she had after the stay turned into bumps that kept growing. Larocque took photos of the affected areas and

sent them to the hotel. She later saw a doctor in Ontario and was given an antihistamine and cream.

Larocque said she is still worried about the marks left on her skin.

“I want acknowledgement that they caused this distress to my body,” she said.

The hotel, however, disputes that the room showed evidence of bed bugs.

In a statement, the Bridgewater Hotel said it believed the concern might have been related to a guest who had recently stayed in Room 107 and later reported the issue. The hotel said it immediately contacted

local pest control company Truly Nolen to inspect the room and nearby areas.

According to the hotel, a Truly Nolen technician did a thorough inspection and found no evidence of bed bugs or signs of bed bug activity. The hotel said it also checked the room itself on two occasions and found nothing.

“We would take any pest-related concern very seriously and will continue to monitor and inspect the room as necessary to ensure the comfort and safety of our guests,” the statement said.

Larocque said her concern goes beyond whether bed bugs can ultimately be confirmed. She thinks the room should not have been given to guests in the condition she found it. After providing the Bulletin with a receipt from her stay, Larocque corrected Bridgewater Hotel’s assessment of Room 107. She stayed in Room 226, and they never followed up to clarify.

“I just feel like people should know what they’re advertising,” she said. “That place is filthy.”

For Larocque, the experience ended up overshadowing what was supposed to be a two-day family visit to Bridgewater and left her wanting the hotel to recognize the impact of her stay.

Local business shuts down after 21 years of serving the community

BRIDGEWATER - After 21 years of ownership, the Pendleton Corner Store on King Street is closing down.

Kathleen Pendleton, known to locals as “Susy”, has owned the store for 21 years alongside her husband.

Before owning the store, Pendleton was a bookkeeper. She and her husband lived in the U.S. when they purchased the building so they could come home to where they grew up.

“Twenty-one years as of June. We were in D.C. and thought, wouldn’t it be nice to find a store that we can live above? And my brother called and told me, ‘Did you know the old store was for sale?’ And we looked into it and bought it before we even saw it.”

After a good run, Pendleton said they have to close the business down due to declining profits and Susy and her partner aging.

“If it made money, which it doesn’t, we would keep it going for a couple more years. We’re also in our 70s, so it’s time to move on to something else,” says Pendleton.

Pendleton Corner has been a cornerstone in Bridgewater for decades, even longer than the 21 years of ownership under Pendleton.

The store was originally run by a man called “Captain Jack,” who owned his own ship and retired to Bridgewater, according to Pendleton.

The corner store had changed hands over the years, being owned by the Corkums and the Paulins.

The building itself is from 1878, only 11 years younger than the Canadian Confederation.

The building survived the Great Bridgewater fire of 1899, which destroyed 54 buildings in the town on King Street, Dufferin and Dominion Street. A fire that resulted in the town’s incorporation a month later to better manage resources.

The building has also been a witness to more modern tragedies in the community as well.

Pendleton provided an important statement for the investigation of the murder of Karissa Boudreau in 2008.

When her body was discovered, Penny was in Pendleton Corner. Susy interacted with Penny and thought her behaviour



was suspicious.

“She (Penny) said to me, ‘Well, you know, we probably should get home in case someone tries to get a hold of us at home.’ And I thought, oh, my lord, if that was me, I would have been running down that road so fast about this mother.”

This statement from Pendleton given to the police increased suspicion of Penny and her boyfriend.

“Some customer heard this story and got a hold of the police. And then the police wanted to hear it that night,” said Pendleton.

The suspicion made Penny a suspect in the investigation. Five days later, the RCMP started to conduct a sting operation on Penny and her boyfriend.

That operation led to her arrest.

Eventually, it was found out that Penny Boudreau strangled her 12-year-old daughter in 2008.

Initially, Penny claimed to police that the girl ran away after the two argued outside a grocery store in town. This story fell apart after her confession in the RCMP operation.

Pendleton was interviewed by author and journalist Sherri Aikenhead, the former communications director for the Nova Scotia Department of Justice, who was present during the court proceedings, in her book Mommy Don’t: A Mother’s Betrayal, to tell her story from that night.

Besides the tragedies, the store and

Pendleton have seen the townsfolk grow up and witnessed a new generation come to Bridgewater.

“With 20 to 21 years in the community, we got to know so many regulars coming here; we watched them grow up, get married and have kids. It’s just mind-boggling. Then they come back, and they go away. Then they come back and say, ‘Do you remember me?’ It gives me goosebumps to think about all the people that have come in,” said Pendleton.

Pendleton said that she didn’t realize how important the store was to so many people in the community and was surprised by the number of people that cared about the store.

“I didn’t realize it was that popular, but since we then put the notice up, it was overwhelming. People are so sad coming in. We feel so bad, but there’s nothing else we can do about it, right? They come in, and they shake my hand. People hug us. It (love) is in the air,” said Pendleton.

Pendleton said that something that would be really special for them would be if somebody won something big on the lottery at their store as one final thank you to the town of Bridgewater, by making someone’s day one last time.

The store is set to officially close on Aug. 31. However, it will be open select days and hours in September to sell off existing inventory, along with shelves and freezers.

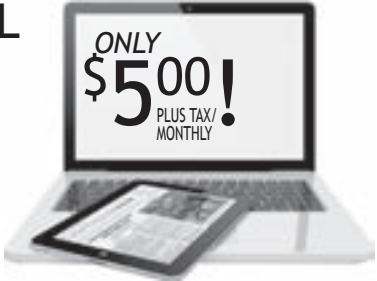

Nova Scotians continue to raise concerns over cellular coverage as provincial program expands

SOUTH SHORE - Concerns about unreliable cellular service are continuing to increase across Nova Scotia, with many residents in rural areas reporting dead zones, dropped calls and trouble finding a dependable signal.

A locally organized Cellular Connectivity Survey has now gathered close to 1,300 responses from Nova Scotians who have shared their ex-

periences with cellular service throughout the province.

Survey organizers report that responses have come from people who cannot reliably make calls at home, lose service while driving on rural roads, and have pointed out exact spots where they must stand to get a signal.

Some people who responded have also expressed worries about what might happen in an emergency if they cannot reach 911.

The survey is aiming for 1,500 responses,

a number organizers estimate would represent about one in every 285 households in Nova Scotia.

These concerns are surfacing as the provincial government continues to expand its Cellular for Nova Scotia Program, which is managed by Build Nova Scotia.

In response to questions from the South Shore Bulletin, Build Nova Scotia said the province is putting more than \$69 million into the program to improve cellular coverage across Nova Scotia.

The organization said that so far, 17 towers have been upgraded, connecting more than 2,100 civic addresses that previously had no service and providing coverage along 127 kilometres of main roads.

Phase 1 of the program is expected to be mostly finished by the end of 2026. Build Nova Scotia predicts this phase will bring coverage to as many as 4,800 civic addresses that did not have it before and 200 kilometres of main roadway.

Still, Build Nova Scotia admitted that more work will be needed to reach the rest of the province’s unserved areas.

“Our government is the first in Nova Scotia’s history to take on gaps in cellular coverage through the dedicated provincial Cellular for Nova Scotia Program,” Build Nova Scotia said in its response.

The organization also recognized the public safety risks linked to poor cellular coverage, especially in rural and remote parts of the province.

“The province recognizes that limited or unreliable cellular service can create public safety concerns, particularly in rural and remote communities,” Build Nova Scotia said.

Outside of the Cellular for Nova Scotia Program, the provincial government says it is working with the federal government, the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC), and telecommunications providers on issues like network reliability, outage communications, emergency preparedness, infrastructure sharing, and roaming agreements.

The province’s efforts to improve cellular service are complicated by the fact that telecommunications is regulated at the federal level.

Build Nova Scotia said that expanding coverage requires co-operation among governments, regulators, communities and telecommunications providers.

“Work is ongoing,” the organization said, adding that the province is still pushing for improvements in areas that do not have enough service.

For residents dealing with poor service, Build Nova Scotia suggests contacting their telecommunications provider directly, since providers have access to information about service, outages and the network for specific places.

Meanwhile, the survey brings attention to the experiences of residents who say they are still struggling with poor coverage even with the ongoing investments.

For people living in rural Nova Scotia, the problem goes beyond the inconvenience of a dropped call. Gaps in service can affect their ability to communicate from home, travel safely on rural roads, and get help when they need it.

With the first phase of the province’s cellular infrastructure upgrades expected to be mostly finished by the end of the year, attention will probably shift to the areas that still lack reliable coverage and what will need to be done to fix those gaps.

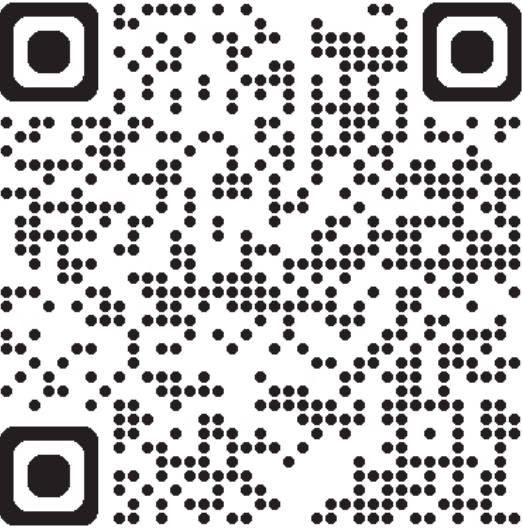

A big splash for Queens County’s new \$8.1-million pool

LIVERPOOL – It’s a short opening season for The Big Splash Outdoor Pool in Liverpool, but Region of Queens Mayor Scott Christian says he hopes they can expand on it next year.

“This is a bit of a trial run this year,” he told reporters after a grand opening event on Aug. 17. Queens MLA Kim Masland joined Christian for the event, along with five regional councillors, municipal staff and the private donors.

“We’re going to continue to ratchet that up and make sure that we can get the most use out of this beautiful facility as we possibly can. ... We would like to continue to find more opportunities for more lane swims, more public swims, get some competitive swimming, racing going on here, and just contributing to healthy, active lifestyles.”

It is expected, depending on weather, that the pool will remain open until the end of September this year.

The \$8.1-million 25-metre, six-lane facility next to Queens Place Emera Centre opened on Aug. 4, after some delays. An outdoor pool operated for years in Milton before it was closed in 2023 because of extensive damage from that year’s floods. The North Queens Aquatic Centre in Caledonia features

an outdoor community pool that is open seasonally.

The goal is to have the new pool open from May 1 to Sept. 30, but the mayor said they’re looking into heating the water to extend the season.

“Really, the only feedback I’m hearing is people just want to see more,” Christian said.

“They want to see it open on Sundays. They want to see the competitive swim team up and running, all those things. The biggest challenge for us in terms of capacity is just staffing. But staff have been great in terms of thinking innovative ways of recruiting people to it, subsidizing training costs, making swim instructor training free.”

The region secured \$3 million from Liverpool’s Murphy family, who owns Mersey Seafoods, and \$2.2 million from the Nova Scotia government for the project. The municipality is picking up the remaining cost.

Final numbers aren’t in yet, but finance officials warned at a recent council meeting that it could go over budget.

The dozens of people gathered for the grand opening weren’t worried too much about that. They were excited to take a dip themselves.

Deborah Herman-Spartinelli, who was a member of the region’s pool advisory committee and the Queens Community Aquatic Society, helped lobby for a new community pool for 10 years.

She was one of the many who took the plunge

after the grand opening.

“It’s wonderful, I think it’s beautiful, and it’s great to see so many people out,” she said. “And I’m glad that we can now recognize the donors because they were a big part of this. It would never have happened without them.”

Holly Murphy-Stenton and Mike Murphy were at the event on behalf of the Murphy family, who originally donated to the pool project anonymously. As part of their contribution, they were also given naming rights.

Mike Murphy said he and Murphy-Stenton considered a list of about a dozen possible names.

“Some of them we just thought, like they were funny to me, but they wouldn’t necessarily age well,” he says. “So, we wanted something that was kind of, I’ll say, timeless, it made you think about a pool. And nothing says fun, youthful pool, than splashing, a big jump into the pool.”

He said the family was happy to work with the region on the project and “glad to be in a position where we could donate to have a community pool.”

“And we just hope that people are able to enjoy this for years to come. It’s important for the community to have a community pool, so we were just happy to be involved.”

Masland, also Nova Scotia’s minister of emergency management, told the gathering that the province was “proud to invest” in the project.

Fleas: A small pest that can become a big problem

As summer heat arrives, so does one of the most common pests pet owners have to contend with: fleas. In Nova Scotia, flea populations typically peak in late summer, particularly around August and September when temperatures and humidity are higher. However, fleas can survive indoors, meaning an infestation can continue long after summer has ended.

Fleas aren't simply an unpleasant nuisance. They can cause intense itching and skin irritation, and some animals develop flea allergy dermatitis, an allergic reaction that can result in severe itching, hair loss, scabs, and secondary skin infections. Heavy infestations can cause anemia, particularly in kittens, puppies, older animals, or pets that are already unwell. Fleas can also transmit infectious organisms and serve as hosts for tapeworms.

The best way to deal with fleas is to prevent them from becoming established in the first place. Ask your veterinarian about an appropriate flea-prevention product for your pet and use it according to the label or your veterinarian's instructions. Pre-

vention may be especially important for pets who spend time outdoors or have contact with other animals.

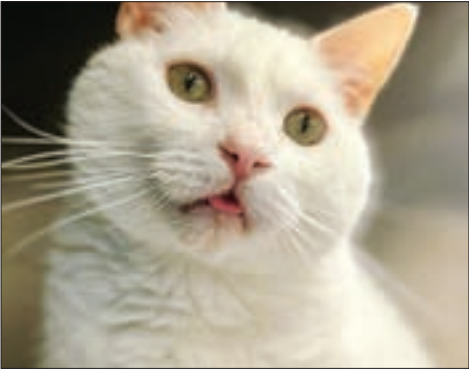
Even indoor cats aren't completely protected. Fleas can enter the home on other pets, wildlife, clothing, or from environments where fleas are already present.

It's also a good idea to regularly check your pet, particularly during flea season. A flea comb can help identify adult fleas or flea dirt, which appears as tiny dark or pepper-like particles in the fur.

If your pet has fleas, treating the animal is only part of the solution. Flea eggs, larvae, and pupae can be found in bedding, carpets, furniture and other areas where pets spend time. In fact, most of an established flea population is found in the environment rather than on the animal itself.

Speak with your veterinarian about the appropriate treatment for every cat and dog in your household. Never use a flea product on an animal unless it is specifically labelled as safe for that species and be particularly careful with cats, as some products containing ingredients such as certain pyrethroids can be dangerous to them.

Your home will need attention as

well. Wash pet bedding regularly in hot, soapy water and vacuum carpets, furniture, baseboards and favourite sleeping areas frequently. For an established infestation, daily vacuuming can help remove flea eggs and immature stages. Heavy infestations may require additional environmental treatment, so consult your veterinarian or a licensed pest-control professional if the problem persists.

Don't be discouraged if fleas don't disappear immediately. Because of their life cycle, established infestations can take weeks or even months to completely eliminate. Consistent

treatment of both the animals and their environment is essential.

As summer progresses, take a few minutes to check your pet's flea prevention and speak with your veterinarian if you're unsure whether your current protection is appropriate. A little prevention can save your pet, and your household, a lot of discomfort later.

Two days in the life of a birder

My plans for Aug. 14 and 15 were to go to Brier Island on Friday and then on a pelagic there on Saturday and then back home.

The first hurdle that I ran into was that everything was booked up from Annapolis Royal, Digby, Digby Neck and on Brier Island. I've left at 2 a.m. and driven to Brier Island for a pelagic starting at 7 a.m. and then back home in the same day.

This is very hard on the system and I did not wish to do that this time around. Luckily, a friend has a cottage on the island without water and electricity. This friend offered me a place to lay my head down and sleep for Friday night.

On Friday, Aug. 14 I had a car appointment for 8 a.m. My goal was to leave straight for Brier Island after the appointment. I got messed up with that plan as my mechanic did not take the car in until 10:30 a.m.

I normally bird on the way to Brier Island and on the way back. I did not bird this time around as I did not get

on the way to Brier Island until 2:30 p.m. Now, for those that have never driven there the trip is about three hours.

This is dependent on catching the ferry across from Petite Passage to Long Island and then the ferry from Freeport to Westport on time. I reached the ferry at Petite Passage and the ramp for the ferry was still down.

They did not let me on but pulled away from the wharf. So, if you miss that ferry, you lose one hour of time.

They did come back early, from the Tiverton side, but the ferry at the other end did not come back early, so I still lost the full hour.

I reached Westport a lot later than I wanted to. I met up with my friend and another acquaintance at Cheswick's and had a feed of fish and chips. I found out that a golden eagle had been seen and a Baird's sandpiper had been found at Pond Cove.

After finishing my meal, I decided to go after the Baird's sandpiper, before going to the cottage to turn in for the night. I did not find the Baird's sandpiper, but did see 10 semi-palmated sandpipers, 45 least sandpipers, 77 semi-palmated plovers and three black-bellied plovers.

I went to the cottage and had a decent night's sleep and then went to the wharf for the pelagic for 6:30 a.m. The boat left the wharf at 7 a.m. It was a good trip, but I can only count what I saw from one side of the boat, so numbers of species were likely double what I saw.

Of note, I saw 94 great shearwaters, 345 red phalaropes, 3,105

red-necked phalaropes, seven northern gannets and 27 Atlantic puffins. There were the most storm petrels that I've ever seen on a trip, with 170 white-rumped storm petrels and 95 Leach's storm petrels. The group also saw a distant south polar skua. I missed a laughing gull on the trip.

Once I reached shore, I found out that there was another laughing gull at Pond Cove. I made another unsuccessful trip for the Baird's sandpiper, but did see 13 sanderlings, 178 least sandpipers, 22 semi-palmated sandpipers, one greater yellowlegs, four semi-palmated plovers, a lesser black-backed gull and I did get to see the laughing gull.

As I mentioned I usually bird on the way to Brier Island and on the way home. This time I headed straight for home as I wanted to get back in time to go to the Chapin Family, the family from Harry Chapin fame, concert at the Lunenburg Opera House. I did make it back for the concert, which was awesome.

Stop calling them “resources”

This morning, over my first coffee, I read a job posting that stopped me mid-sip.

A casino was hiring. A VIP relationship manager. A full-time professional whose entire job is to make the business's most valued guests feel known. To remember their name, their drink, the story about their daughter's wedding.

To notice when someone hasn't been in for a while and reach out. To make one person feel, every single time they walk through the door, like the most important person in the room.

A business is paying a very good salary for exactly that and it works. The most powerful force in hospitality has never been the product. It's the feeling of being seen.

We hire people to do that for our customers. Who is doing that for the people who work for us?

Think about where our energy actually goes. We agonize over the guest experience — the greeting, the little touches, the follow-up, the reasons to come back.

We invest real money in making strangers feel like regulars. Meanwhile the people who create every one of those moments get an employee handbook and a spot on the schedule.

We spend our whole relationship budget on the people who visit, and almost nothing on the people who make the visit worth making.

That's not just cold, it's bad math. Your team isn't the thing that supports the product. Your team is the product. Every warm welcome a guest feels was delivered by someone who either feels cared for that day, or doesn't. You cannot fake your way past that. It walks in the door with every person who clocks in.

Let's start with the words. We call it “human resources.” Sit with that phrase for a second. A resource is a thing you use up — like the linens, the liquor order, the water bill. Something to be allocated and stretched and eventually replaced. I'll take bets that nobody in the history of work has ever felt more loyal after being called a resource. The language gives us away. It tells our people exactly what they are to us before we've said a single word.

Take that VIP host mindset, the one the casino is paying good money for and point it inward, at your own team. Watch what happens to the ordinary jobs we've been calling paperwork.

Hiring stops being “filling a position” and becomes an invitation, you're not plugging a gap, you're welcoming someone into something worth belonging to.

A new person's first day stops being a stack of forms and becomes a genuine welcome, the way a VIP is welcomed: expected, prepared for, greeted like someone you've been looking forward to rather than someone you're processing.

The dreaded annual review? A good host would never wait 11 months to

check in on their best guest. The once-a-year review is where good people go to feel like a line item, replace it with a real conversation that never actually stops. And the moment someone leaves, the part most owners handle with a shrug and a final paycheck becomes the most revealing moment of all.

How you treat someone on their way out is the most honest advertisement you will ever run, and every person still on your team is watching how it goes.

I've started calling this whole idea the Keep Factor, the sum of every reason a good person has to stay, and to come back. It's the one number no spreadsheet tracks and every great

operator feels. And it doesn't come from a bigger budget. It comes from a decision: to treat the people inside your walls with at least as much intention as you treat the guests you're trying to win.

The casino figured out that one dedicated relationship is worth more than a hundred transactions. We already know that in our bones, we just keep aiming it at the wrong door.

Two days in the life of a birder

On Monday, Aug. 17 I went to Rose Bay to Sand Dollar Beach to see the American avocet. I also saw 320 semi-palmated sandpipers, 110 least sandpipers, 11 short-billed dowitchers and a greater yellowlegs. A peregrine falcon was patrolling and I managed to get photos of it as it swooped back and forth after the shorebirds and then perched for quite a time in a tree.

On Aug. 20 I made another trip to Rose Bay and was joined by Wilma Clancy and on that day we saw the American avocet, 80 semi-palmated plovers, 110 least sandpipers, 62 short-billed dowitchers, three sanderlings, six greater yellowlegs, 30 semi-palmated sandpipers and four greater yellowlegs. Two northern harriers were patrolling and a merlin gave us great viewing. Going out the causeway there were 10 yellow-rumped warblers and one northern parula.

On Aug. 21 I joined my friend Dorothy Poole and we went birding in Queens County. We found good numbers of migrants at the Leaf & Garden disposal site at West Head and also at Sand Beach Provincial Park. For warblers we had one bay-breasted warbler, 14 palm warblers, seven common yellowthroats, one bay-breasted warbler, three yellow warblers, a magnolia warbler and two black and white warblers. Four gray catbirds were a treat. At Sand Bay Beach we had four spotted sandpipers, a solitary sandpiper, a killdeer and a greater yellowlegs.

We stopped by Beach Meadows Beach on the way back and saw 50 short-billed dowitchers and four greater yellowlegs. There would have been more shorebirds, but the tide was high.

Logan Moore found an American golden plover and a dunlin at Kejimikujik Seaside Adjunct. Jason Dain saw a laughing gull at Crescent Beach (Lunenburg County). On Aug. 22 Jason Dain found a Baird's sandpiper off Louis Head. Mark Dennis saw three stilt sandpipers at the Guzzle on Cape Sable Island.

At the time of writing the American avocet was still present. Loads of shorebirds were still at Sand Dollar Beach, Oxner's Beach and Crescent Beach (Lunenburg County). On Aug. 24 lots of American herring gulls and some common terns were hawking insects at Crescent Beach (Lunenburg County). On Aug. 25 Emerson Fiske located a laughing gull at Hirtle's Beach.

On Aug. 22 Rick Brown found three solitary sandpipers at Egypt Road in Yarmouth. He had three golden plovers and pectoral sandpiper at Chebogue Point. On Aug. 24 Rick Brown spotted an eastern kingbird at Bunkers Island.

Alix d'Entremont reported two eastern kingbirds, a Cape May warbler, a northern waterthrush and a bay-breasted warbler at Pubnico Point. While doing shorebird surveys from Aug. 15-25, Logan Lalonde at Pond Cove on Brier Island had 22 species of shorebirds and 94 species of birds.

Good birds for Halifax Municipality were Hudsonian godwit, The Northwest Mainland had a little blue heron. The crested caracara continues at Pugwash. From this area there also was a little blue heron and a Caspian tern. The valley area reported a blue-gray gnatcatcher, American golden plovers and a red knot.

INGREDIENTS

- 4-6 bonein chicken thighs
- 3 cups corn kernels
- 2 cups green beans
- 2 cups zucchini, chopped
- 2 cups cherry tomatoes
- 1 red onion, sliced
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp mustard (grainy or Dijon)
- 1 tbsp vinegar or lemon juice
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tsp salt
- ½ tsp pepper
- 2-3 tbsp fresh herbs (dill, parsley, basil)

PREPARATION

1. Heat oven to 425°F. Line a large sheet pan with parchment.
2. Toss corn, beans, zucchini, tomatoes, and red onion with olive oil, salt, pepper, and garlic.
3. Pat chicken thighs dry and place on top. Brush lightly with mustard.
4. Bake 35-40 minutes until vegetables are caramelized and chicken is golden and cooked through.
5. Whisk mustard, vinegar/lemon, and herbs. Drizzle over the hot pan.
6. Refrigerate for up to 4 days. This is your base for multiple meals.

Variations for multiple different meals:

- Serve cold mixed with greens and toppings of your choice and sliced chicken over the top
- Reheat and add pasta with tomato sauce
- Stuff into pita with spinach
- Add beaten eggs to some of it and bake into a frittata

“The Rug is a rare horror film for us to show, but it was so well done. It’s the story of an elderly woman who finds a carpet being thrown out by some neighbour and she takes it home, and she finds that it’s a very hungry carpet.”

The Asbury Short Film Show has been packing them into theatres since 1981. The idea grew out of the late ’70s, when LeClaire and a few friends at the New York Institute of Technology on Long Island would put on public showings of their work.

“It started as a party, but 250 people came,” he says.

“So, we moved on and started to refine it, and it became the Asbury Film Festival,” so named after the street where the show was developed.

“And each year it got bigger while we were all working in our individual jobs in the (TV and film) industry and raising kids and then eventually, it became a Manhattan thing every year and in 1999, we started touring with it to various places.”

By 2015, it became a year-round gig, he says.

“We’re not the Rolling Stones,” he jokes. “We have, like, 20 shows, but still for us, that’s what we can handle. But we’re pretty proud that it’s been in a lot of different places and we’re really, really happy to be coming back to Nova Scotia. Love it and hopefully they’ll let me into the country.”

Wood and metal items will be collected on the following dates:

Town of Bridgewater:
September 8 - 11, on your collection day

Town of Mahone Bay: September 14, entire Town collected

District of Lunenburg:
September 29 - October 9, on your collection day

Combined Wood & Metal Collection Limits:
Bridgewater: 100 kgs (220 lbs)
Mahone Bay: 2 cubic metres (2.6 cubic yards)
District: 4 cubic metres (5.2 cubic yards)

- Place wood and metal in separate piles.
- Wood and metal items up to 1.8 m (6 ft.) long accepted. Remove spikes and brackets over 15 cms (6 in.) from wood.
- Drain gas and oil from lawnmowers and other items containing fluids before placing curbside.
- Drop off household hazardous waste, propane tanks, fridges, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers at South Shore Waste Solutions, 908 Mullock Road, Whynott’s Settlement.
