Lunenburg Opera House to get \$6.2 million retrofit

Extensive renovations ahead for 1908 facility

LUNENBURG – It’s official. The Lunenburg Opera House, owned by the Folk Harbour Society, is receiving a cash injection of \$6.2 million to bring the facility up to modern standards and at the same time rejuvenating the entertainment venue. The announcement was made Aug. 6 by Member of Parliament Jessica Fancy, along with visiting Member of Parliament for Burlington, Karina Gould. Also on hand for the announcement was Mayor Jamie Myra and Tom McFall, chair of the Lunenburg Opera House Restoration Committee and Vice-President of the Lunenburg Folk Harbour Society.

“When I first was elected, the opera house association were one of the first people to reach out to me to show me what they were working on in terms of the re-development. I learned very quickly how important this building and what it has brought in the past, what it is doing in the present and just how important this building is to the future,” said Fancy.

“Its survival is a testament to the people of this community...who have stepped forward to protect this building because they understood that losing it would mean losing a part of Lunenburg identity. That’s why investments like these matters.”

The money is part of a \$51 billion ‘Build Communities Strong Fund’ that will be made available to a wide slate of infrastructure projects across the country that support economic prosperity, housing, sport, culture, education, health, transit and climate adaptation.

“When we talk about building communities strong, I feel like we’re talking about much more than roads and our water systems and our public buildings, we’re talking about preserving places that bring people together that are strengthening local economies and help define who we are. For more than a century, this landmark has woven into history here in Lunenburg,” said Fancy.

The project will transform the five-storey Lunenburg Opera House into a modern, accessible and energy-efficient performing arts venue with a new stair and elevator tower.

The heating, cooling, ventilation, electrical, plumbing and security systems will be upgraded and the building envelope will be enhanced with high-efficiency insulation and energy systems.

The accessibility of the building will be improved with the installation of an elevator and

the reconfiguration of the main entrance for barrier-free access.

The project will also address structural integrity and improve essential amenities such as washrooms and lighting. Heritage interior finishes will also be restored.

“The Lunenburg Opera House has been a part of the fabric of this town for generations. It’s much more than a beautiful historic building. It’s a place where our stories have been shared, creativity has flourished and our community has come together,” said Mayor Jamie Myra.

“This federal investment will preserve an important piece of our heritage; it’s also about investing in our future. It will allow this project to move forward and ensure the opera house will serve the community, while expanding the opportunities that provides for arts, culture, education and gathering today. It will be an economic hub of year-round tourism and growth.”

After sharing some of his fond memories of the Opera House from his younger days, gathering with his friends to watch movies, like Jaws... he added...

“I hope today’s investment will be remembered as a catalyst that created countless new memories for families throughout the town. Today’s announcement helps ensure that this remarkable building remains a vibrant, living part of our community, not just for today, but for generations to come.”

In a hand-out book designed to show the current facilities matched with the vision of the opera house:

The Main Hall – Restoration will include the reinstatement of period features that had been removed – including the ceiling brackets, wainscoting and stage curtains. Faithful attention to the many historic features will be complemented by advanced design for sound, lighting and film projection.

Lowest level – the lowest level of the Opera

House, will be referred to as The Cellar. It will offer a smaller (about 50 people), more intimate performance space. Development of this level will provide space for green rooms, additional washrooms and access to the backstage area of the main hall.

Upper Hall – Often referred to as the WOW room. One restored, the hall will offer a venue for music recitals and other related offerings as well as a high-quality space for community meetings, banquets and conferences.

The attic, currently undeveloped will offer an ideal space for offices, studios and a board room, with the Folk Harbour Society using some of the space for its headquarters.

In conclusion, McFall, who said it was tough to keep the announcement secret for the past month, said, “This is really thrilling and I hope you think so too.”

HISTORY:

Built in 1908, the Opera House has served many purposes., startng aas the home of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows who constructed the building and used the upper floor as their lodge.

The main floor served as a performance hall with numerous musicals, live theatre, operatta and glee club performances. In the 1930s, it was converted to a movie theatre, until the 1970s when it returned to a performance venue.

By the 1990s, the Opera House was in need of renovations and many organizations sough to acquire and restore the structure unsuccessfully.

In 2006, the Opera House was purchased by a local entrepreneur, who undertook a series of renovations. Again, it was put up for sale and the Lunenburg Folk Harbour Society saw the opportunity and with some great support from the community, they were able to purchase it and later in December 2019 paid the mortgage completely off.

Editor's note: This is a letter that has been passed onto hospital administration and local municipal officials, as well as the South Shore Bulletin.

The Editor,

We are writing on behalf of the residents of Nafthal drive to formally raise a serious and ongoing quality-of-life concern resulting from South Shore Regional Hospital's recent expansion. Since the installation of new air conditioning and ventilation systems, our neighbourhood has experienced severe, continuous noise pollution that is significantly affecting the health and well-being of residents.

- Specifically, we are experiencing:
- 24/7 noise disturbance with no relief, disrupting sleep and daily life
 - Chronic stress and anxiety among residents due to ongoing, unrelenting noise exposure
 - A fundamental change to the character of a historically quiet, residential neighbourhood
- South Shore Regional Hospital has served this community for over 30 years without this level of noise impact. We recognize and value the hospital's role in the community, which is precisely why we believe this issue can and should be resolved collaboratively and in good faith.
- We are respectfully requesting the following actions from hospital administration:
- A professional acoustic engineering assessment of the new HVAC/ventilation equipment



- Implementation of noise mitigation measures (e.g., sound barriers, enclosures, equipment adjustments, or scheduling changes) sufficient to bring noise levels in line with what the neighbourhood experienced prior to the expansion
 - A designated point of contact within the hospital administration for ongoing communication with affected residents
 - A meeting with hospital administration and/or facilities management to discuss this matter directly and review our documentation, including noise measurements and resident impact statements
 - A written response with a proposed timeline for remediation
- As this is our first formal contact with authorities on this matter we are

copying the Town of Bridgewater administration, Nova Scotia Health, the Nova Scotia Department of Environment and Climate Change, and our MLA on this letter to ensure the issue is on record with all relevant bodies from the outset.

We would welcome the opportunity to meet with hospital leadership or facilities staff at your earliest convenience to discuss this matter and work toward a resolution that supports both the hospital's operations and the well-being of the surrounding community.

We appreciate your attention to this matter and look forward to your prompt response.

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Working families encouraged to apply for Habitat for Humanity homes in Liverpool, Bridgewater

SOUTH SHORE - Habitat for Humanity is planning to build three new affordable homes this year on the South Shore.

The non-profit group's Nova Scotia chapter is asking low- to middle-income families in need of housing to apply to be the new owners of one of two properties in Liverpool or one in Bridgewater.

It will be the first time in at least five years that Habitat has built any houses on the South Shore.

Donna Williamson, CEO of Habitat for Humanity Nova Scotia, says land on Amherst Street in

Liverpool and on Pinecrest Boulevard in Bridgewater was donated to the organization more than five years ago.

"We just thought if we have land and we can build on it, we should be building on it.

"Our goal is to double our impact year after year. We only had budgeted and planned for two builds for 2026, but after learning that we could possibly subdivide the Liverpool lot, and get a third home in, we went back to our board for approval and they approved that we could move forward with a third house on the South Shore."

Williamson says one of the myths about Habitat for Humanity homes is that they're given to families for free.

In fact, the new owners must be able to pay a mortgage capped at 30 per cent of their income. The mortgage is interest-free and no down payment is required.

Potential homeowners must also pass a credit check, commit to 500 volunteer hours and demonstrate they're in core housing need as defined by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation.

"Families have to purchase the home at fair market value," Williamson says.

"Our focus is on the middle class because that is where the biggest housing gap is. What we're seeing more and more is that the middle class are being pushed out of the housing market."

A 2023 report from the South Shore Housing Action Coalition found that there was a housing shortage in Queens County of about 370 units. To keep pace with population growth, the study said the region needed 555 new housing units by 2027.

For Bridgewater, the housing shortage was measured to be 245 units and the town would need 450 units by 2027 to keep pace with demand.

Blueberry-Balsamic
Chicken
& Greens Bowl

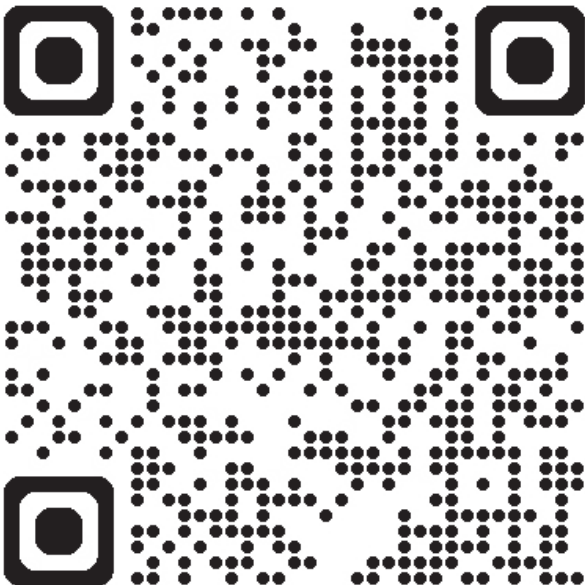
INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups fresh blueberries
- 2 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 1 tbsp maple syrup
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp black pepper
- 1 lb chicken breasts or thighs, sliced
- 6 cups mixed greens (spinach, arugula, or spring mix)
- 1 cup cooked quinoa or rice
- 1/3 cup crumbled feta or goat cheese
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh basil or mint

PREPARATION

1. In a small pot, combine blueberries, balsamic, maple syrup, garlic, salt, and pepper. Simmer 8–10 minutes until berries burst and mixture thickens slightly. Mash lightly with a spoon.
2. Heat olive oil in a skillet. Add sliced chicken and cook 6–8 minutes until browned and cooked through.
3. Pour half the blueberry mixture into the skillet and toss to coat. Let it bubble for 1–2 minutes so it clings to the chicken.
4. Divide greens and quinoa among bowls. Top with blueberry-glazed chicken.
5. Drizzle remaining blueberry glaze over each bowl. Add feta and fresh herbs.

The Big Splash Outdoor Pool opens in Liverpool

LIVERPOOL – Queens County’s much-anticipated new outdoor pool opened on Aug. 4, as the municipally operated facility offered free public swims in its first week.

The estimated \$8.1-million pool, named The Big Splash by an anonymous donor who contributed \$3 million to the project, is a heated, 25-metre, six-lane facility next to Queens Place Emera Centre. The Nova Scotia government gave \$2.2 million, with the Region of Queens picking up the rest of the tab.

It was built by Axios Construction of Halifax.

The final costs haven’t been released, but at a recent regional council meeting, finance officials warned it could come in over budget. They stressed, however, that they wouldn’t know the actual expense until construction was complete.

The region has hired 10 lifeguards to staff the pool from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Swimmers have the choice of a shallower leisure pool or the more standard 25-metre lap pool.

Municipal officials said before the pool opened that their goal is to have it operational every year from May 1 to Sept. 30, depending on staffing.

Costs to use the pool range from a day pass of \$4 to \$6, depending on your age, to a pool-only membership of \$70 for most adults. Seniors and youth pay lower rates. People with annual fitness centre memberships at Queens Place can buy a pool add-on for \$25 to \$35, depending on their age.

Swimming lessons are also being offered for various age levels and at various rates. Full information is available on the Region of Queens website at regionofqueens.com.

The pool is closed on Sundays, but open Mondays to Thursdays from 9 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., Fridays from 9-4 and Saturdays from 10-3.

More housing projects have begun in the past year in Queens County. The Queens Neighbourhood Co-operative Housing Ltd. is building 30 new affordable units on Lawrence Street in Liverpool with a move-in date of January 2027.

A new eight-unit public housing complex opened this summer on Old Port Mouton Road.

The Stedman on Main Street in Liverpool promises to add 17 apartments to the housing mix. And two private housing developments in the Mount Pleasant area are projecting to add more than 100 units at a cost of at least \$475,000 each.

Williamson says Habitat is building three-bedroom, detached homes that will be move-in ready. She said they plan to start building this month and be finished by Christmas.

“I think the need on the South Shore is just as great as the need everywhere else in our province. Our economy can’t exist if people don’t have houses to live in. Businesses in those areas sometimes struggle to find employees because there is not adequate affordable housing.”

People interested in living in a Habitat for Humanity home need to complete the expression of interest form on their website at habitatns.ca/homeownership-program.

And Williamson stresses that they want to give working families a chance to own a home.

“We have had challenges in the past trying to find families for our homes, especially in rural areas of Nova Scotia,” she says.

“I think it’s just the belief that families have to be low-income, and the families that can actually afford homeownership feel that they might make too much money. And they don’t want to take homes away from low-income families. So really, it’s getting the message out there that Habitat sells homes at their market value, to working families who have the income to support the purchase of the home.”

Barrington Recplex officially opens

BARRINGTON – An estimated 200 people attended the official opening of the Barrington Recplex facility Aug. 5.

Attached to the Sandy Wickens Memorial Arena, the facility consists of a multi-use gymnasium with a walking track above it, meeting rooms, a kitchen, an open area and a warm place to meet and watch some hockey. Cost of the facility was about \$9 million.

“It’s an incredible day in Barrington. When you have a facility like this open, it’s ultimately about people, about people connecting, people moving – those are the town non-negotiables for optimal living,” said Warden Shaun Hatfield.

The facility was financially supported by the various levels of government and through the community.

“This facility will definitely strengthen our community for years to come. Our children and our grandchildren will be beneficiaries of everything that has happened here today,” he added.

Among those in attendance were municipal officials, youth from the day camp program, MP Jessica Fancy, Lucy the Lobster and Kim Smerek of Port Clyde, the winner of the lobster design contest that was open to the public.

Smerek said that she had submitted two proposals and both were accepted. So then, she had to come up with one design that encompassed both concepts.

The more than six-foot lobster is made of fibre-glass and is covered in paintings that shows what goes on at and around the facility, such as curling, skating and even a touch of the community gardens. It will be a permanent fixture at the facility.

Hatfield said that the journey to replace the old community ‘hall’ began in 2018 and said there have been several challenges along the way, opening a year later than estimated and coming in at about \$500,000 over budget.

CAO Chris Frotten said that there were several speed bumps along the way, from clearing the land, ordering materials and others.

It has been a long time coming

LUNENBURG – A celebration was held at the Fishermen’s Memorial Hospital July 30 as a five-bed hospice unit in the hospital was officially announced.

This project has been in development since funding was originally announced by the provincial government in 2021 and these are the first hospice care beds in Lunenburg and Queens counties.

Reaching this milestone required careful planning to ensure the hospice could open with the right people, processes and supports in place to provide high quality, end-of-life care.

“This included recruiting and onboarding staff and physicians with specialized palliative and end-of-life care expertise, establishing the clinical model of care and appointing a medical director to oversee the development and operation of the hospice,” said Jennifer Lewandowski, senior advisor, public affairs, content and media relations for Nova Scotia Health in an e-mail.

Dr. Patricia Caldeira, was that doctor and she was appointed to that role in 2025.

The hospice opened through a passed approach beginning in January 2026, which allowed the new team to become fully established as beds came into service. All five hospice beds are now operational and occupied and it was noted that since the January opening, 30 people have been through the unit.

Several partners were thanked for their help in getting things up and running such as the South Shore Hospice Palliative Care Society, the Health Services Foundation of the South Shore and the Fishermen’s Memorial Hospital Auxiliary.

The project was supported through provincial government funding announced in 2021 – their commitment was \$1 million per year.

Caldeira said that she recognized the need for a hospice space soon after moving to Nova Scotia five years ago.

Now, “just a few months in, I can’t remember how we managed without it.”

She said the process has been long, but they took their time to make sure they got it right.

“The process in getting here wasn’t easy. Even with many setbacks, we never lost sight of the goal,” she said. “Instead, we stepped back, re-evaluated and redesigned. Looking back, I think we did exactly what we needed to do. We moved carefully and took the time to do things right.”

She said that providing end-of-life care is not only a privilege, but also meaningful work that calls for expertise and compassion. She added that each person that makes up the team is special and they are passionate about what they do.

“The first bed was an exciting milestone, but we

continued to recruit and train additional staff to build one bed at a time and to get to where we are today,” she said.

The care team consists of physicians, nurses, social workers, occupational therapy workers, health care aides, dietitians and volunteers.

Trudy Johnson, founder and chair of the South Shore Hospice Palliative Care Society said she was so proud.

“These five beds have already been fully utilized to fill a tremendous void for the residents of the community to provide by providing a place of dignity, quiet solitude and privacy for families during one of the most difficult times of their life,” she said, adding that she has heard nothing but high praise for the staff that are in place.

Johnson then added this is “just a tremendous first step,” and the need is steadily increasing – “we will continue to work to get more.”

Lunenburg MLA Susan Corkum-Greek said, “this has been a long time coming. I’m so pleased to be here and celebrate our collective achievement of the opening of the much-needed, long-awaited palliative care beds.”

She said that it has been a tough wait as an MLA and a Lunenburg with deep roots in the community, seeing constituents and family that could have used this unit over the past many years.

But with many hands and a re-orienting at the top of Nova Scotia Health, approaching the project as a hospice model from a palliative unit, changed the trajectory of how they got to this point.

She thanked everyone for their hard work and dedication to making this project a reality.

The Yellow-crowned Night Heron

I had gone after a few yellow-crowned night herons this year without success.

Early on during the morning of Aug. 2, Ethan Sarty, Miguel Morales and I set out for a trip birding. We spent four hours and saw 53 species. Our target was a yellow-crowned night heron at White Point and another at Carter's Beach and we got to see both birds.

The yellow-crowned night heron nests in Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Tennessee, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, and along the Atlantic Seaboard from Massachusetts south into Mexico and Central America to Guatemala and the Gulf Coast through to the Florida Keys and to Key West.

The yellow-crowned night heron is similar in sex and they are 55 to 70 cm long with a wingspread of 100 to 110 cm. They are a stocky and uniformly gray heron. The adults have a black and white face and a white crown. The crown is often suffused with yellow. There is a stout thick bill.

They rarely eat fish, but the diet is mostly crayfish and some crabs. In Florida they eat a lot of land crabs. They also eat mussels, fiddler crabs,

some frogs, aquatic insects, snails, small snakes, lizards, leeches and terrapins.

On July 10 at Oxner's Beach Deborah Kiceniuk found a great egret. On July 31 Carrie Ann Thomas and I

took a trip to the Bay to Bay Trail and Long Hill. We had 24 species with highlights of veery and hearing hermit thrushes. There were few warblers about, but we did get yellow-rumped warbler, ovenbird and magnolia warbler.

On Aug. 1, I led a field trip for the Bay to Bay Trail. We did a little bit of Long Hill and the part of the trail by Long Hill. We had 25 species. We had one least flycatcher, a few brown creepers and for warblers black and white warbler, black-throated green warbler, and yellow-rumped warbler.

One person accompanied me to the Fauxburg side of the Bay to Bay Trail. We found northern parula, ovenbird and American redstart. We also saw northern flicker, eastern wood pewee, veery and blue-headed vireo.

On Aug. 2 I saw my first Hudsonian whimbrel for the year at Andrew's Head in East Berlin. On Aug. 4, Barbara McLean and I went on a bird outing. We were out for three hours and were happy to see 20 barn swallows at the Back Older Farm Marsh.

We went to Shoreline Drive in Blue Rocks and saw a nice grouping of migrants there. On Aug. 4 Miguel Morales sighted 400 semi-palmated plovers at Crescent Beach. He also saw some ruddy turnstones on that day.

On July 30 Logan LaLonde reported two Caspian terns at Grand Passage. J D Bharvad found a black-necked stilt at Dominion Beach in Cape Breton. Jason Dain reported a scissor-tailed flycatcher at Clam Harbour on Aug. 1.

Danny Cameron sighted a yellow-crowned night heron at Cape Sable Island. Mark Dennis found a northern rough-winged swallow at Danial's Head on Cape Sable Island. Yvan Sarlieve reported a yellow-crowned night heron at the Head of Jeddore on Aug. 2. As per Mark Dennis another one was still at Newellton on Cape Sable Island. Michelle Fletcher spotted two sandhill cranes on Milford Road.

On Aug. 4 Alix d'Entremont and Kathleen MacAulay found a royal tern at Cape Forchu as well as two south polar skuas. Logan LaLonde noted numbers of Cory's shearwaters off Brier Island.

Bertin d'Eon sighted a purple martin at Blanche. Jake Walker spotted a long-tailed jaeger off Morden. On Aug. 5 David Currie found a great egret at Rainbow Haven. A number of Caspian terns are being reported and 30,000 to 35,000 semi-palmated sandpipers at Evangeline Beach.

Someone came in for a quiet Tuesday dinner and instead of writing about the food or the room, both worth their own post, they wrote about me.

They noticed the bookend. Greeted at the door, walked out at the door. A quiet word to a server here, a table setting nudged there. Everywhere, they said, without ever being in the way. They noticed how the staff carried themselves, trusted to do their jobs, supported and not hovered over, mentored and not managed. And then they said the thing that stopped me cold: that this is a craft, not a job.

I read it three times. Then I sat with a strange, squirmy feeling because sharing something this kind about yourself feels a lot like standing in the middle of the room and asking to be looked at.

So, I almost didn't.

Then I caught myself. I'm not sharing this to be seen. I'm sharing it to say, out loud, that being seen is the whole game and to point at the people who need it most. The second you turn that lens outward, it stops being a mirror and becomes a window.

What I'll share, even though it isn't humble: it landed on me. I'm the CEO of my businesses, I choose who I work with and I design my own days. I get

to do the work that fuels me, I'm the one calling the shots and a stranger noticing how I moved through a room still got me square in the chest.

That's not a soft admission, it's the argument because if being seen can move me, from where I sit, imagine what it does for the person just starting their career or entry into the workforce, who has never once been told they're good at this.

Imagine it for the sixteen year 16 year old bussing tables in their first ever summer job, halfway through the summer, still convinced they're one dropped fork from being sent home, when someone stops and says you're good at this.

Imagine it for the dishwasher. The one guest who we will never see, whose name will never make it into anyone's review, keeping the whole night running from the room nobody thinks about. What happens the first time they realize someone noticed them anyway.

Imagine it for the one coming back, after the illness or after the years home with the kids, and after the chapter that knocked the wind clean out of them. Rebuilding one shift at a time, half braced to be found lacking and instead, seen as capable. Whole.

Imagine it for the person who's been told their whole life that this is just a job. A stepping stone, something to do until the real thing comes along, when the truth is they're already standing in

the middle of the real thing.

It's not just a summer job, it's not just a shift and you are not just the boss, you're the one deciding who in that room gets to feel real.

That's the craft, not the plating and not the lighting. The noticing. It's the quiet engine behind every team that stays, every guest who comes back, every how do they keep such good people? and it's the whole reason I ask the question I ask...

Would you want to work for you?

To Angela, who wrote that post: thank you for seeing me. I'm going to

spend the rest of my days making sure every single person who works beside me feels exactly that.

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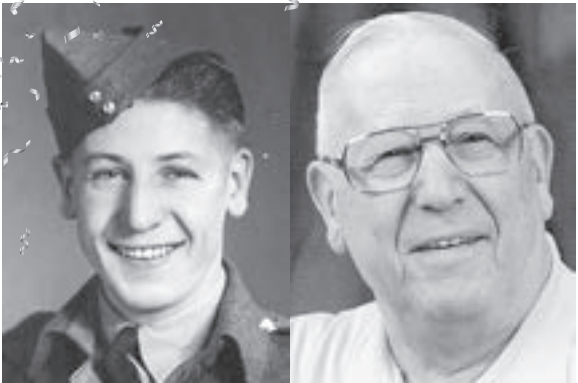
