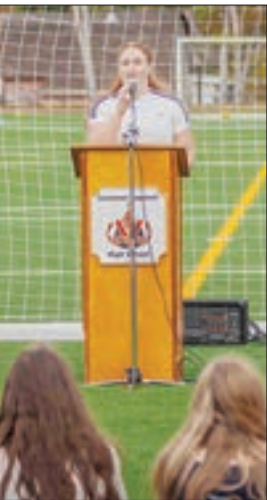

Honouring greatness Three inducted to Olympic Wall

LIVERPOOL – It was an afternoon of celebration, standing room only, at Queens Place Emera Centre as two athletes and a coach were inducted to the Olympic Wall at a special ceremony held Oct. 9.

Special Olympic snowshoe athletes Rebecca Delaney and Jillian Young are the newest athlete inductees, along with their coach, Susan Inglis who was chosen to be a part of the Team Canada coaching staff. All three attended the 2025 Special Olympic Games held in Italy.

Both athletes earned gold medals, with Delaney earning one in the 4x100m relay and Young earned gold in the 200m race.

Speakers at the event was Region of Queens Mayor Scott Christian; two-time Olympian and two-time competitor at the Pan American Games, Lisa Ross; and Mike Greek with Special Olympics Nova Scotia.

The three banners were unveiled during the ceremony, alongside of Brian Ward, David Rudderham, Owen Hamlin, Jamie Belong, Betty Ann Daury, Jenna Martin, Alexander Shan- kel, Ben Theriau and Sarah Mitton.

“I really wasn’t much of an athlete growing up. I could never dream that I would ever be on an Olympic wall or anything like that. It is a privilege. Special Olympics is such an amazing organization, and I’m privileged to be a part of it,” said Inglis, who is also Delaney’s mother, making them the

first mother-daughter duo on the wall.

“People think that because you are from a small town that you aren’t going to get anywhere. But look at Sarah Mitton and Jenna Martin and the others on the wall. I went to Italy and saw the talent on the world stage and saw how our athletes measured up to that world talent. It really is amazing.”

She was named as one of the coaches for Team Nova Scotia that will compete next summer in the national games in Medicine Hat and is contemplating whether she wants to apply for the next Worlds that will be held in Chile.

“I’m super proud,” she said of all the Special Olympians on the wall. “I have coached all of the Special Olympic athletes up on the wall. People don’t realize the commitment they have to training. Maybe they think that it is not at a high level of performance, but for them it is and their training is difficult. They have to really push themselves.”

She echoed the thoughts of the special speakers at the event, saying “look out Queens Place, you are going to need more room.”

THE WALL

The Olympic Wall was created in 2022 as a space created to recognize the accomplishments of high-performance athletes, coaches and officials from the community who have participated in World Olympic, World Paralympic and World Special Olympic Games. With the Oct. 9 additions, there are now 12 honoured on the wall.

Chester opens first public works depot

CHESTER - The Municipality of Chester opened its first-ever public works depot on Sept. 22 marking a major step in modernizing local infrastructure services.

Located at 643 Highway 14 (Windsor Road), the \$2-million facility will house all public works staff and equipment under one roof, ending years of operations spread across six different storage sites. The property includes 11 acres, seven of which are dedicated to storage and fleet management, providing space for future growth.

“This new Facility provides the space, efficiency, and capacity needed to manage today’s services while preparing for tomorrow’s challenges,” said Warden Allen Webber. “It is a smart and cost-effective investment for our residents and communities in the long-term.”

The depot offers offices, workshops, secure storage, and staging grounds. By centralizing operations, the municipality expects better inventory control, safer storage, and faster response to community needs such as snow and ice removal, wastewater management, and road maintenance.

Annual operating costs are projected

at \$15,000 – about \$2,000 less than the cost of leasing off-site storage. Construction costs of a new building are estimated at \$5 million plus land.

Public works oversees six wastewater treatment plants, 18 pump stations, 13 municipal properties, 50 km of trails, five km of sidewalks, four km of municipal roads, and multiple wharves and boat launches. This year alone, the department is managing nearly \$45 million in capital projects, with \$99 million planned over the next five years.

The new facility also positions Chester for the future, supporting major wastewater expansion projects and the possibility of a new potable water plant. With the Village of Chester Wastewater Treatment Plant under a two-year upgrade, the depot ensures uninterrupted space for staff and equipment.

Residents will continue to access most services at the municipal office on King Street or through the new depot. Green cart orders, sewer permits, and road permits will be available both in-person and online at www.chester.ca.

The depot’s location—close to Highway 103 and centrally placed within the municipality—will improve travel efficiency for crews and reduce delays in responding to weather events, infrastructure repairs, and other urgent needs.

Church celebrates completion of green energy project

FIRST SOUTH – The First South United Church members recently celebrated the completion of their green energy project.

This journey began last November in an effort to reduce their carbon footprint and become more energy efficient. Being aware of climate change and the harm of fossil fuels, they felt a sense of responsibility to make a change to do their part for the planet.

They conducted their own energy audit, devised an energy efficiency decarbonization plan, obtained quotes for all areas of the project, and set up an account at a local building supply store where some of the supplies were purchased.

The formal application was then submitted to Faithful Footprints, a grant program through the United Church of Canada, that is designed to reduce financial barriers for United Church communities of faith to complete energy efficiency and decarbonization building projects.

The application included outlining their plan, budget and two year’s worth of energy data. Upon receiving approval from the Faithful Footprints Grant



Program, the planned project began.

An application to Efficiency Nova Scotia for a Rebate was completed and upon receiving approval of acceptance for this rebate, they moved forward to start the work.

The congregation voted 100 per cent in favour of seeing this project being taken on by their small church. This was going to be a leap of faith and trust that God would guide them on their path. One that was full of planning, hard work, sweat, perseverance, def-

initely a few sleepless nights, digging, replacing, plenty of fundraising (with a few more to come) and lots of emails, zoom calls, phone calls and discussions with the contractors.

The Faithful Footprints Grant Program has received and accepted the church’s final report. They have sent their grant monies to First South United Church with congratulations for completion of this endeavour.

Turkey Cranberry Quesadilla

Turkey leftovers are a much-loved follow-up to Thanksgiving. Instead of the usual turkey soup or hot turkey sandwich, how about this easy and delicious alternative?

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tbsp butter
- 2 medium tortillas
- ½-¾ cups chopped/shredded turkey
- ¼ cup cranberry sauce
- 1/3-½ cups shredded mozzarella
- 1/3-½ cups shredded marbled cheddar
- Optional: sour cream

PREPARATION

1. Top the first tortilla with half of the shredded cheeses.
2. Add the turkey and cranberry sauce as layers.
3. Add the second half of the cheeses and top with the second tortilla.(Note: avoid having the ingredients too close to the edge to avoid them spilling out. About an inch from the edges works well.)
4. Heat up a large skillet over medium-low heat, add butter and let it melt.
5. Place the tortilla on the skillet and cover.
6. Grill the tortilla on each side until golden brown.
7. Remove from the skillet and let it cool for a couple of minutes; cut into thirds or quarters and serve. Sour cream always makes a lovely side with a quesadilla.

Tollermania: A gift from one man’s best friend

NEW GERMANY — What started as one man’s tribute to his best friend has grown to an annual gathering bringing hundreds of people, and their dogs, from around the world to this small rural community on Nova Scotia’s South Shore.

Now in its fourth year, Tollermania is a three-day celebration of the Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever (toller for short), the official dog of Nova Scotia since 1995.

Founded by Dan Barnhill to bring together a few people who had followed his adventures online with his toller best friend, Diesel, Tollermania is a heartfelt memorial to Diesel and a fun gathering for toller owners and their dogs from across Canada, the United States and beyond.

“Diesel was special,” said Dan on day two of the event. “He went to work with me every day of his life. We travelled all over North America together — 1.3 million kilometres driving. He really was my best friend.” Dan and Diesel spent their weekends in New Germany on the land he bought to get away from the city. He calls this place the Diesel Dog Ranch.

“I was just looking for a big piece of land where I could hunt and fish and not have any neighbours and enjoy the tranquility of it,” he said with a laugh. “And I still do — except for three days a year.”

When Diesel died in April 2021, Dan said it took him more than a year to deal with the loss. After much encouragement and requests from his online toller followers to visit his Diesel Dog Ranch, Dan invited supporters to come; hundreds signed up, and Tollermania began in 2022.

The weekend event includes water and hunting trials, agility courses, wooded walking trails, memorial resting places and an auction. Inside the on-site kitchen bunkie, where homemade food is served, there’s a tribute wall featuring pictures of lost tollers with the words “May your souls run through these woods forever.” Ashes of more than 20 dogs now rest on the property, making it a final resting place for these beloved companions.

The annual event is a big boost to the local economy, bringing in an estimated \$750,000

each year. Money raised at the ranch is donated, with 80 per cent of proceeds going to Toller Rescue and 20 per cent to ElderDog Lunenburg County.

Behind the scenes, about 25 volunteers help organize everything — from working the kitchen, directing on-site parking, running the events, selling goods such as T-shirts, hats, and staffing the toller museum set up in the basement—all to ensure a memorable weekend for all.

For Melissa, Dan’s wife, Tollermania has been a journey of her own. She said she found herself “hiding in the kitchen” during the first year, unsure what to expect.

“I remember thinking, (when Dan told her of his plans), You’re crazy — we’re inviting how many

The rock and the hard place

There may be times when we find ourselves with a conflict so profound, so unsolvable, that it truly is like being between a rock and a hard place. No matter what you do; what creative solutions you dream up, reality keeps telling you that nothing you do will resolve this.

In the book, *Take Charge of Your Life*, Dr. Glasser refers to these situations as a type of “true conflict.” He also suggests that compared to “false conflicts,” true conflicts are relatively rare. False conflicts are those that can be resolved but often require work that we are not prepared to do. By comparison, in a true conflict, no matter what we do, we cannot get what we want.

My observation is that true conflicts tend to be those that involve other people, whom of course we cannot control. If what someone else wants is in serious conflict with what we want, and it’s in an area that affects our lives together, then we have conflict.

Glasser cites the example of Jeff and Kelly. Jeff was offered a great job on the other side of the country. His wife, Kelly, is an only child who will not leave her aging parents in this area.

There is no negotiation that will resolve this. Seemingly reasonable options have been discussed, but the conflicting pictures remain a fact. It’s a true conflict.

Is there anything we can do when involved in a true conflict?

Glasser offers two suggestions. Both may seem counter-intuitive but could nevertheless be worth considering.

The first suggestion is to do nothing. Yes, that sounds odd, doesn’t it? But when we have a strong impulse to do something in a conflict, we may act in ways that are counter-productive. For example, we might try to dull the conflict-caused pain with drugs or alcohol, we might rant about the problem to friends and family, and so on.

Those actions don’t help, do they? We alienate people who care for us with our complaining or dull our abilities to cope with substances. Ultimately, these actions damage our body and our relationships.

Thus, doing nothing is a strategy. Keep in mind that even though we are doing nothing, the world goes on. Time passes, people change, events happen. An attitude may soften; a new and different offer may appear.

Pretty slow birding this past while

Bird Notes

I was away to Toronto in the Scarborough area from Oct. 1 through 5. I had good birding while there.

On the home front, I've been told by quite a few birders that things have been slow. Hartlen Point has been productive though.

Near the end of September quite a few pectoral sandpipers had been moving through and as of Oct. 5 there were still a lot being seen. On Oct. 4, Kevin Lantz spotted seven of these birds at Steverman's Lake in Lilydale as well as a white-rumped sandpiper.

Before going to Ontario, I made a trip to the Blanche Peninsula and Bacarro on Sept. 30. Joe Holmes joined me and we had 45 species, which isn't too bad. Our best bird was an eastern phoebe.

Raptors on the move were turkey vultures, Northern harriers, an osprey, a red-tailed hawk, sharp-shinned hawks and bald eagles. We only found three species of warblers, which were yellow-rumped warbler, palm warbler and black and white warbler. It was exciting to see a yellow-bellied sapsucker and a hermit thrush at a couple of locations.

On Oct. 6, I birded from LaHave to Bayport and into Garden Lots and then at Shoreline Drive in Blue Rocks. I then

went to Lilydale into Bridgewater and back to LaHave. I had 32 species.

At the Back Oler Farm Marsh there were 30 green-winged teal. The only warblers I found were yellow-rumped. Shorebirds there were seven lesser yellowlegs and one greater yellowlegs. At Shoreline Drive in Blue Rocks there was still a swamp sparrow around. A merlin was patrolling as was a northern harrier.

The harrier put much fear into a greater yellowlegs, four green-winged teal and American black ducks as it passed close to these birds. At Lilydale I spent quite some time watching 350 European starlings hawking for insects. It was also wonderful to see three wood ducks, seven hooded mergansers

and a red-winged blackbird there. An immature bald eagle standing on the exposed mud of Steverman's Lake was also exciting to watch.

Upon returning to Nova Scotia, on Oct. 7, I again made a trip to Shelburne County to Cape Sable Island, Bacarro, Blanche and Port Clyde. I had 35 species for the day. Warblers were scarce with just yellow-rumped warblers and a common yellowthroat. As I drove past Cherry Hill a hermit thrush flew across the road. A solitary sandpiper at Blanche was great to see.

Other shorebirds were black-bellied plovers, greater yellowlegs and lesser yellowlegs. Hawks were scarce with only two American kestrels at Bacarro. There was a small raptor flight near Port Clyde with a red-tailed hawk, three turkey vultures and one broad-winged hawk. There was a wood duck at Vogler's Cove on the way back home and I saw an American woodcock at Bell Cove Road in Dublin Shore.

On Oct. 6 Logan Moore spotted three

red knots at the Keji Seaside Adjunct. I didn't spend a whole lot of time birding on Oct. 8. At Dublin Shore I had a single common yellowthroat.

Shorebirds at Crescent Beach were 15 semi-palmated plovers and at Risser's Beach there were two greater yellowlegs. There are tons of ring-billed gulls now at Crescent Beach. Craig Cook saw a northern harrier in Kingsburg on this date.

In Cape Breton, good birds seen between Sept. 30 and Oct. 8 were prairie warbler, a ruff, a yellow-throated warbler, Baltimore orioles, chimney swifts, an indigo bunting, orange-crowned warblers, clay-coloured sparrows and Hudsonian godwits.

From Sept. 29 to Oct. 8 good birds in the Halifax Municipality were yellow-billed cuckoos, a lark sparrow, and clay-coloured sparrows.

On Sept. 30 Ronnie d'Entremont discovered two clay-coloured sparrows at the Stan Rogers Folk Festival Grounds in Canso. On Oct. 1 he had a lark sparrow at Union Street.

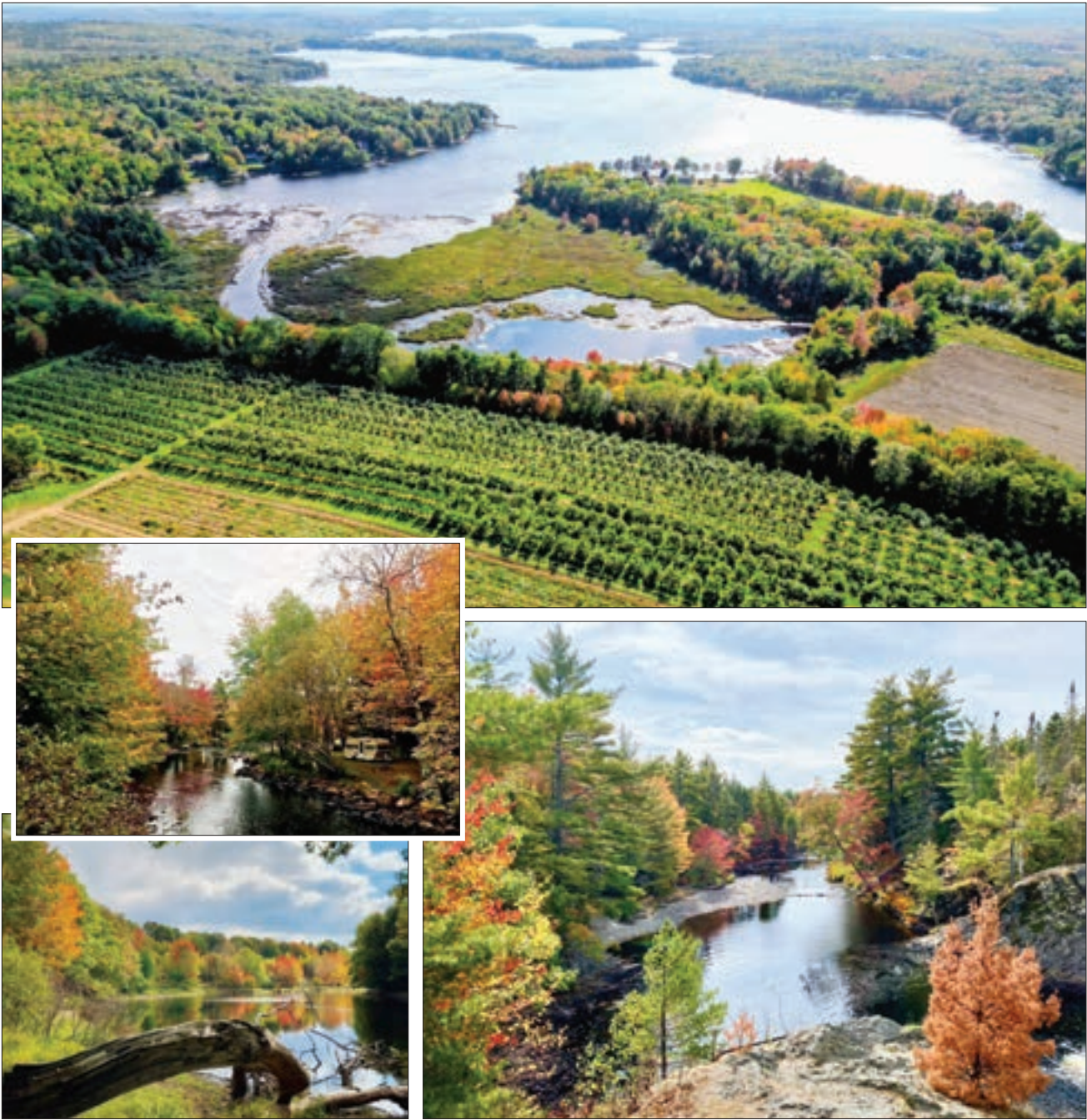

people to our property, and I don’t know any of them?” she said, laughing. “Diesel was the first toller I ever met, and now our whole world is tollers. The people are wonderful, but I just really love meeting all the different dogs.”

Dan and Melissa were married during the second Tollermania (T2 as regular attendees call it), surrounded by friends, family, and of course, tollers. Today, they share their home with two tollers, Oakley and Zoe, and Dan says he has plans to keep Tollermania going for at least 12 more years with something new each year.

And Tollermania enthusiasts look forward to it. Ellen Emond and Nancy Moses, met at T2, discovered they were both from Connecticut, and returned this year with their dogs Pinot and Roady. “We come back to see friends and their dogs,” they said. “All the dogs are so different in their personalities and the way they bond with people.”

For Ole and his wife, visiting from Germany, this year marked their first Tollermania. They heard about the event while visiting Halifax with their toller, Inga and were keen to meet other toller owners. Katja flew in from B.C. after attending T3 because “there’s nothing like this” anywhere.

Derek Gunn and his wife have bred tollers for nearly 40 years and met Dan when he came looking for a dog. “We picked Diesel (for Dan in 2007) — and Dan did the rest,” Derek said. “We never expected anything like this...he loved (Diesel) so much.”

“Growing up, I wanted my fame to be from racing motorcycles (or better yet, snowmobiles). I now realize that what most know me as is Diesel’s dad, and I’m ok with that.”

Diesel’s gift to Dan extends far beyond one man’s best friend. It includes a boost to the local economy during Tollermania, funds to support a dog rescue and elder dogs – and for Dan, Melissa and all those in attendance – the gift of friendship bound by the love of tollers, while keeping the spirit of one unforgettable dog alive.

When managers hide in their offices behind paperwork instead of being present on the floor, the message is: “I’m invisible here.”

These aren’t “small things.” They’re micro-moments that quietly build or break trust. They shape whether people show up excited or show up counting the hours until they can leave.

Because here’s the guiding force: Leadership isn’t neutral. Every single day, you’re either building trust or you’re breaking it. There’s no middle ground.

Three questions you need to answer right now

1. When was the last time you actually “saw” the employee bathroom?
2. Can you name one personal fact about your newest hire – something that matters to them?
3. How many hours this week were you visible and present with your team versus hidden in your office?

If those questions made you uncomfortable, good. That discomfort is information.

Here’s what happens next:

Walk into your workplace as if you were a new hire on their first

day. What are the first three things you notice? Do they tell you this is a place where people matter? Or do they tell you no one’s really paying attention?

The little things aren’t little. They’re the reasons people stay or the silent reasons they leave.

This is the work I do with service business owners who are tired of the revolving door. We don’t fix this with better job postings or higher starting wages. We fix it by rebuilding the micro-moments that make people want to stay.

Because the truth is, people DO

want to work. They just don’t want to work in places where they feel invisible, unheard, and disrespected in a thousand tiny ways.

The question isn’t whether anyone wants to work anymore.

The question is: Have you created a place worth staying for?

On Oct. 2 Angela MacDonald located a white-crowned sparrow and an orange-crowned warbler at Port Hilford. Ronnie d’Entremont found two more clay-coloured sparrows, an orange-crowned warbler, a prairie

warbler and a blue-gray gnatcatcher in Canso.

On Oct. 5 Eric Mills reported a gyrfalcon on Brier Island. Kyle d’Entremont had a brown thrasher at Hartlen Point. A fox sparrow was seen by Angela MacDonald at Port Hilford on Oct. 6.

Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop spent two days at Canso and great sightings were of white-crowned sparrows, five clay-coloured sparrows, two dickcissels, two blue-gray gnatcatchers, two lark sparrows, two prairie warblers, an eastern kingbird, an indigo bunting and an orange-crowned warbler.

On Oct. 7, Ray Wershler discovered a sharp-tailed sandpiper with pectoral sandpipers at Hartlen Point. Eric Mills reported that the wood stork was still at Brier Island.

In Southwest Nova Scotia good birds reported from Oct. 1-8 were yellow-billed cuckoos, a brown thrasher, a rusty blackbird, a lark sparrow, a red-bellied woodpecker, a red-headed woodpecker, a Philadelphia vireo, and a yellow-crowned night heron. The Valley reported sandhill cranes, a lark sparrow, white-crowned sparrows, a Leach’s storm petrel, a Lincoln’s sparrow and a clay-coloured sparrow.

Doing nothing, however, doesn’t mean “sit on the couch and play games.” We must still do our best work, treat everyone with grace and kindness; remain diligent and respectful. See what happens as time passes.

The second suggestion is to do a time-limited trial. You can tell people that’s what you’re doing, or not tell them. That’s up to you. In your trial, choose a side and act accordingly for a period of time. Glasser’s examples suggest six months, but it’s your trial, you choose what makes sense for you.

For example, Jeff’s trial could be to take the new job, try it for six months. See what happens. Maybe Kelly will join him after all. Maybe her parents will decide that they’d like to move too.

Or his trial could be to stay where he is for six months. If he keeps working diligently, maybe a new, better job will appear that doesn’t require a move.

In either case, the same rule applies: do your best work, treat everyone with good will, and keep your eyes open.

Remember that these suggestions are for true conflicts. If the conflict is within yourself, a different strategy may be more effective. We’ll look at that shortly.

Proposed Text Amendments to the Land Use By-law

Bridgewater Town Council is considering amendments to the Land Use By-law to update the definition of “Residential Care Facility, Home for Special Care, Group Home or Small Option Homes”. New track and field complex officially opened

LIVERPOOL – The new \$3.5 million track and field complex located at the Liverpool Regional High School (LRHS) was officially opened Oct. 8.

Several honoured guests were on hand, including hometown Olympian Sarah Mitton, MLA Kim Masland, Nova Scotia Premier Tim Houston and Region of Queens Mayor Scott Christian.

The new complex, located at the Liverpool Regional High School, features South Shore’s only outdoor turf soccer field and rubberized track, along with a long-and triple-jump runway and landing pit, a new shotput area and it is fully lit.

“It feels amazing. It was a great day to celebrate everything and reflect on how long the process has been,” said Kristopher Snarby, president of the Queens County Track Society, the group behind getting the project done.

“The dream started more than a decade ago. It’s been a long time coming and it’s just great to have this type of facility in the area.”

Snarby is also an LRHS graduate and a former teacher at LRHS.

“Students literally ran around the bus loop as their track. We never had a track, not even a gravel one, in the county, so just to have a track is amazing,” he said. “The turf field is awesome

as well. Typically, we haven’t been able to use the field until June and then we are done by October, but we can use this year-round. It’s huge.”

The \$3.5-million project was led by the Queens County Track Society, with support from all three levels of government and the community. The province invested \$1.2 million, the federal government contributed \$1.8 million, the Region of Queens provided \$250,000 and local donors and sponsors added another \$250,000.

RQM Mayor Scott Christian gave thanks for everyone who helped make this project a reality.

“The work that was done by the Queens County Track Society was incredible. I’m going to highlight the work that Jack Fancy and Todd Symes did. The two of them had a vision back in 2012-13 and they pushed and pushed and were persistent enough to get some major money from the province and the

feds... Props also to Kristopher Snarby who stepped in as the chair of the society and I think who really got this project across the finish line,” he said.

“We were happy through the Community Investment Fund, through the Region of Queens, to contribute a quarter of a million dollars to the project. It just shows how volunteers working together with levels of government can make something big happen.”

Snarby thanked all of the donors, especially Steele Auto Group, who secured the naming rights for the facility.

“Steele Auto Group really stepped up for us. They were super keen to help us – it’s a 10-year deal, but hopefully after 10 years, they will renew it and keep the same name. We are very pleased to have this partnership,” he said.

Snarby also mentioned the Queens Soccer Association who purchased new soccer nets which they are leaving at the facility for everyone to enjoy.

He says they are not done with the complex yet. Next steps are to put in security cameras, add some bleachers and possibly buy some new equipment.

“The heavy lifting is done and now it’s just about promoting it, getting more users on it. That is probably our biggest challenge – awareness. There’s still a lot of people that don’t know it exists, because it’s tucked away and not on the main drag,” he said.

“We have to get the word out that we have this amazing track and field facility that anyone can use. We just need to get the word out there.”

To use the facility, you must become a member at just \$25 a year. With that, you will get a code for the gate, and you will have access to it at any time, depending on rentals, of course. He said the main operating hours are from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.

“Right now, we have a few walkers that go out at 6 a.m. and we have the lights programmed so they aren’t walking in the dark,” said Snarby. “We also have a few kids that use it during the evenings as well. Also, if a group wants to rent the facility, they just have to reach out to me at queenscountytrack-society@gmail.com.”

The event featured several speakers, the official first soccer shot taken by Masland, a skills showcase by local middle school and high school players and a race by athletes from the Lunenburg-Queens Special Olympics.
