Staff shortages reason for Canada Post delays

SOUTH SHORE - Readers across the South Shore have faced weeks of inconsistent newspaper delivery, with dozens of customers reporting that they have either received their copies of the *South Shore Bulletin* late or not received them at all.

The delivery problems have continued for several weeks, with complaints coming in throughout July. Each week, the *Bulletin* has logged dozens of failed deliveries, leaving some subscribers waiting for their newspapers or going in person to the *Bulletin's* office to get a copy.

For subscribers who pay to have the newspaper delivered, the repeated disruptions have caused concerns about

how reliable the service is and made it hard for customers to know when, or even if, their newspaper will show up.

The *Bulletin* first reached out to Canada Post about the issue in late June. At that time, Lisa Baskin, a service representative with Canada Post, said the company had checked with the local depot and found no reported service disruptions in the B4V postal area.

"We've connected with the local depot, and there are currently no reported service disruptions in the B4V area, all routes have been operating as scheduled this week," Baskin wrote in an email to the *Bulletin*.

"Based on this, delivery should be proceeding as normal."

Baskin recognized the concerns being raised by readers and said Canada Post

would keep monitoring the situation.

"That said, we understand your concern given the feedback received," she wrote. "I'll continue to monitor the situation closely and follow up with the depot if additional reports come in to ensure we're not missing anything localized."

Still, complaints continued in the weeks that followed.

Throughout July, the *Bulletin* received dozens of reports from subscribers who said their newspapers had not arrived or had arrived much later than they expected. Some customers tried to solve the problem themselves by visiting the Canada Post office to ask about their missing newspaper.

Tancook islands set for high-speed internet upgrade this fall

TANCOOK - More than 180 homes and businesses on Big and Little Tancook islands will soon be able to access reliable high-speed internet thanks to a project that will link the islands to the mainland using almost six kilometres of submarine fibre optic cable.

This work is part of the Internet for Nova Scotia Initiative, a province-wide effort led by Build Nova Scotia to expand high-speed internet access in communities that have not been well served. The Tancook islands project is the only one using submarine fibre, which means it needs specialized marine equipment and carefully planned construction.

This week, cabling supplies and equipment are being moved by barge from Halifax Harbour to a staging area in Blandford, where installation is expected to start soon. Nearly six kilometres of fibre optic cable will be placed along the ocean floor between the mainland and the islands.

The project will also include installing about eight kilometres of aerial fibre. Construction is expected to finish in early fall.

When it is complete, the infrastructure will allow Bell fibre optic connections for homes and businesses on Big and Little Tancook islands.

Danielle Barkhouse, MLA for Ches-

ter-St. Margarets, said she has heard directly from Tancook residents about the problems caused by unreliable internet service.

“I’ve heard directly from Tancook residents about what it’s meant to go without reliable internet, and it’s rewarding to see this project underway,” Barkhouse said.

She said the new connection will help residents get better access to health care and education, and it will also support people who run businesses from their homes.

“Nearly six kilometres of submarine fibre will connect more than 180 homes

and businesses, and reliable internet like this supports everything from healthcare and education to running a small business from home,” she said.

Currently, the Tancook islands have internet access through fixed wireless service and the province’s Satellite Internet Service Rebate Program. The rebate program is meant for places where reliable high-speed wired or wireless service is not possible or where an infrastructure project has not yet been finished.

Bell Canada Executive Vice-President and Chief Technology Officer Mark McDonald said the company has

experience with network deployments in rural and remote communities, including subsea fibre infrastructure. “Connecting Canadians is at the core of what we do,” McDonald said. “We are proud to bring that experience to the Tancook Islands through this important initiative, helping deliver reliable, high-speed connectivity to residents and businesses.”

The Municipality of the District of Lunenburg has also taken part in efforts to improve broadband access in rural areas.

Queens councillors want to fast track safety improvements at downtown intersection

LIVERPOOL – A busy Liverpool intersection that hasn’t been changed in more than 140 years is slated to become safer, with Region of Queens councillors saying the work should be done as soon as possible.

First, however, they agreed at their Aug. 11 meeting to hire engineering

firm CBCL at a cost of \$36,503 to provide a “shovel-ready” re-design of the area at Main and School streets.

The company also did a review of the intersection in 2024, which recommended extending the curb to narrow the roadway on the south side of the east Main Street approach. But they advised against a four-way stop, which is one of the improvements local residents want to see.

The intersection is one of the main

routes to get to Queens General Hospital, and to Mersey Point and Western Head. It regularly has school buses, tractor-trailers and other large vehicles trying to navigate the tight corner.

It’s been an area of concern for local residents for at least a few years. In November 2023, more than 130 people signed a petition calling on council to install a four-way stop because the

Police locate stolen SUV with replica handgun, drugs and cash

BRIDGEWATER – On Aug. 11 at 8:10 a.m., Bridgewater Police Service (BPS) was alerted by Lunenburg District RCMP that an SUV’s occupants were involved in a firearms complaint in the Upper Branch area of Lunenburg County.

The suspects had since left the altercation scene and were believed to be heading towards Bridgewater. BPS patrol, K9, Criminal Investigative Division (CID), Street Crime Enforcement and Criminal Intelligence Service of NS (CISNS) officers immediately secured all possible entry points while exploring possible identities and vehicle information.

During that unfolding investigation it was discovered that the SUV was stolen from a residence in First South. At 8:47 a.m. officers intercepted the stolen vehicle at Highway

103, Exit 13 carpool parking lot in Wileville.

Due to the complainants’ information that a firearm was present, officers conducted a high-risk traffic stop. The SUV occupants, two adult males and one adult female, were arrested without incident.

Police recovered the stolen SUV, an imitation handgun, a quantity of cocaine, prescription medication, cash, scales and other drug paraphernalia.

The three adults have been released on undertakings with conditions and will appear at Bridgewater Justice Centre on Oct. 7, 2026, for arraignment. The investigation continues and multiple theft, drug and weapon charges are pending.

Mayor Elspeth McLean-Wile said reliable high-speed internet has become more important to rural communities, both for residents and for businesses.

“Residents will soon have access to fibre-to-the-home service that will strengthen connectivity, support economic opportunities and improve access to services,” she said.

The Tancook Islands project is the final phase of the Internet for Nova Scotia Initiative’s South Shore project area. About \$37 million has been provided to the broader area through contributions from the Nova Scotia Internet Funding Trust, the Municip-

ality of the District of Lunenburg, Bell Canada, Eastlink, and other partners.

According to the province, more than 103,000 locations that previously did not have good service have gained access to high-speed internet through the Internet for Nova Scotia Initiative, leaving fewer than 500 locations without service. The remaining projects are mostly in areas where the geography makes construction harder.

Nova Scotia says the initiative has helped bring reliable high-speed internet to almost 100 per cent of underserved homes and businesses in the province, making it the first province or territory in Canada believed to have reached that level of coverage.

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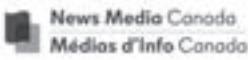
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Filmmaker seeks family photos to tell forgotten stories of City of Monticello victims

SHELBURNE - More than 125 years after the City of Monticello went down off the coast of Yarmouth County, resulting in the deaths of 36 of the roughly 40 people on board, filmmaker Thomas Lynsky is working to make sure the victims are remembered as more than just names in a history book.

Lynsky, who runs the YouTube channel, PartTimeExplorer, is making a feature-length documentary about the 1900 shipwreck and is now reaching out to families across southwestern Nova Scotia for photographs, artifacts, and personal information related to those who were aboard.

The City of Monticello sank during a strong southwest gale on Nov. 10, 1900, about four miles off Cape Forchu while it was traveling from Saint John, N.B., to Yarmouth. Only four people made it out alive.

For Lynsky, this disaster is the kind of overlooked maritime story he has tried to share with a broader audience through his work. His earlier projects have covered other Nova Scotian maritime disasters, such as the SS Atlantic and SS Hungarian.

“The City of Monticello has always felt like a story that people have heard of,” Lynsky said. “Those are the stories I want to bring to light; the ones that are there just asking to be told.”

The planned documentary will be between 90 and 120 minutes long and aims to provide a close look at the disaster and the people involved. Lynsky is also creating computer animations based on old shipyard plans to recreate the vessel and help bring the story to life visually.

But one of the main challenges for the project is finding faces for the people who died.

Out of the 40 people on board, Lynsky said he has only found photographs of two so far.

“I know some more must exist in people’s family photo albums, and I’m



asking people to take a look so that I can put a face to these names on screen,” he said.

Lynsky has searched archives in Yarmouth, Barrington, Cape Sable, and Shelburne, and has also been working with museums and archives throughout the region. He is especially interested in photographs, but other personal details and artifacts related to the wreck could also help the production.

Among those he is especially hoping to find photographs of are Captain Thomas Middling Harding of Barrington, Captain Harvey Newell of Cape Sable Island, Katherine “Kate” or “Catherine” Smith of Cape Sable Island, Elsie MacDonald of Yarmouth, Nehemiah Murphy of Yarmouth, Ida Lawrence of Yarmouth, Austin Wickens and Walton Cunningham of Cape Sable Island, Fred and Wynne van Amburg of Pubnico, and Robert Nickerson of Yarmouth.

The crew included about 14 people from Shelburne County, according to Lynsky, though the exact number depends on how “from” the area is defined.

Some were seasoned mariners with established reputations. Others were young men who had not originally planned to make the trip.

The ship’s departure happened to coincide with the federal election, so some regular crew members expected

to be away from home. In their place, family members and friends, including some who were too young to vote, joined the vessel.

“None of those substitutes survived,” Lynsky said. “It’s a terribly unfortunate story.”

He hopes photographs and family material will help him tell these personal stories instead of presenting the sinking only as a historical event.

Lynsky is also searching for artifacts related to the wreck. He said debris washed ashore after the sinking, and some pieces were kept as souvenirs by local families.

The filmmaker is working with the Yarmouth County Museum and Archives, Barrington Museum Complex and Archelaus Smith Museum, along with the Chapel Hill Museum, Shelburne Museum Complex, and institutions in New Brunswick and the United States.

“This is the community’s heritage, and I want the community to be a part of the project,” he said.

Lynsky said he has also come across questions about the cause of the sinking that he thinks deserve more investigation. Two inquiries were held after the disaster, but he said neither one clearly established what caused the vessel to go down.

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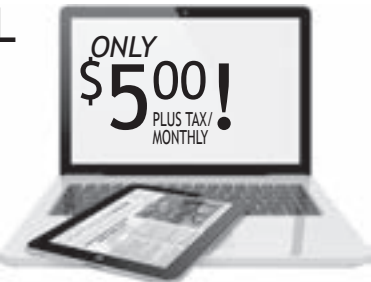

Veteran recognized for his peacekeeping service

BRIDGEWATER - Members of Branch 24 RCL in Bridgewater gathered Aug. 9, 2026 to recognize the National Peacekeepers’ Day in Canada.

During the ceremony at Veterans’ Memorial Park, one of the members of the Legion was presented the UN Peacekeeper Nobel Peace Prize Certificate of Recognition.

Comrade Bob Shupe was a member of the Canadian military and served as part of the United Nations Operation in the Congo which took place in the Republic of the Congo from July 1960 until June 1964. This marked a milestone in the history of United Nations peacekeeping in terms of the responsibilities it had to assume, the size of its area of operation and the manpower involved.

It included, in addition to a peacekeeping force

which comprised at its peak strength nearly 20,000 officers and men, an important civilian operations component.

Originally mandated to provide the Congolese government with the military and technical assistance it required following the collapse of many essential services and the military intervention by Belgian troops. ONUC became embroiled by the force of circumstances in a chaotic internal situation of extreme complexity and had to assume certain responsibilities which went beyond normal peacekeeping duties.

The Honourable Becky Druhan, MLA Lunenburg West presented the certificate that was made available by the Nova Scotia government and said that so many ceremonies that are recognized sadly are focused on war and this honour is to recognize Canada as a peacemaker and was so happy to present this recognition in person.

He is hesitant to share details while his research is ongoing but said he is looking into evidence that could possibly change the understanding of what happened.

In the end, though, Lynsky said the documentary is about the people who were lost.

“Until now, these people have been a small footnote in local history,” he said. “What I’m hoping, especially for families of the victims, is for people to see that these people aren’t forgotten.”

He is asking people to get in touch as soon as possible, with mid-September expected to be the cutoff for material to be incorporated into the project.

The finished documentary will be released on the PartTimeExplorer YouTube channel. Lynsky hopes the film will introduce the City of Monticello disaster to audiences far beyond southwestern Nova Scotia while giving descendants a chance to see their relatives’ stories preserved on film.

“I want relatives to see this and walk away appreciating that someone took the time to sit down with their ancestor’s story,” he said.

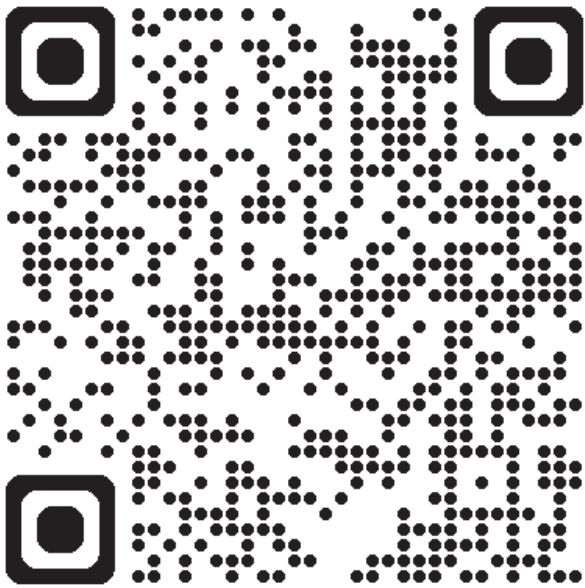

Queens councillors want to fast track safety improvements at downtown intersection

intersection had become a “significant hazard” for pedestrians and motorists.

The municipality expropriated the property at 89 Main St., which is on one corner of the intersection. That was after the owner disobeyed an order to clean it up after a fire at an abandoned house there in 2024.

Garrett Chetwynd, the municipality’s manager of public works, told councillors that CBCL would report back by mid-February 2027, and that the intersection would be finished by March 2028.

District 3 Coun. Courtney Wentzell, who represents the area, said that’s not quick enough.

“I find 2028 unacceptable and I’m sure most of the residents down there do,” he said. “They had a petition going around, it will be three years old now and we’re back here talking about things not getting accomplished. ... I don’t know if anybody’s ever watched a tractor-trailer try to turn up that street.

“It’s just, 2028, my God. ... But if anybody ever witnessed that street when school’s out and all the buses are coming down that street, there’s a very serious safety concern of the residents that live in that area. And I find 2028 quite unacceptable. I know over the last few days, my laptop has blown up on this whole issue.”

District 6 Coun. Stewart Jenkins tried to allay Wentzell’s concerns, saying the work would most likely happen over the 2027 construction season.

“In reality this job is a 2027 job. I’m thinking ... if we were lucky enough to have it as a summer job or end-of-summer, early fall is what we should be looking at.”

CAO Willa Thorpe said that if councillors want the project prioritized, staff would do that but it could delay other projects in the region’s capital plan.

In response to a question from District 5 Coun. Jack Fancy, Thorpe said that contracting out the work would also be considered, depending on what councillors want.

Councillors supported improving the intersection, but differed on how to pay for the CBCL study.

Deputy Mayor Maddie Charlton, who represents some residents in the area, wanted the money for the latest study to come from the region’s accumulated surplus, instead of the area’s tax district’s \$740,000 reserve.

“I think it’s unfair to continuously punish District 13 (taxpayers),” she said.

Jenkins said he didn’t want it coming out of the general surplus, because residents in his area around Greenfield “put a lot of money into the region and therefore we’re putting a lot of money into Liverpool, and I don’t think that’s fair.”

Regardless, he said the important thing is to get the work done.

Councillors voted 4-3 in favour of Charlton’s amended motion to pay for it from the accumulated surplus. Councillors Fancy, Jenkins and Vicki Amirault voted against. Mayor Scott Christian was away on vacation.

They supported Charlton’s other idea to call on the region’s traffic authority to implement interim safety measures at the intersection until the work is finished.

Brooklyn Recreation Association working with Sarah Mitton on hometown shot put training facility

BROOKLYN – World champion shot putter Sarah Mitton will soon be able to stick close to home to train for the 2028 Summer Olympics, in the same park where she began.

The Brooklyn Recreation Association is partnering with the two-time Olympian from Brooklyn to build a shot put pad in the community’s Hank Snow Playground.

The non-profit group oversees the playground, the Brooklyn Waterfront Park and Brooklyn Community Hall.

Min Smale, the association’s secretary-treasurer, said volunteers had discussed the idea a few years ago, but “put it on the back burner” while they concentrated on other projects.

“And then we got a call from the Mitton family, and (they) said Sarah doesn’t want to be in Toronto all the time. This is her home. She wants to be with her family. And how can we support her hometown and give her space to train?” Smale says.

“So, when Sarah was home at one point, she said this is actually the perfect space, the perfect length that she needs to be able to do her throws and not have to re-invent the infrastructure too much.”

That perfect space is an area at the back of the playground that had been used as an outdoor skating rink. The project will install new concrete to competition specifications, a painted throwing ring and distance markers.

It’s also safely separated from other areas of the playground.

Mitton says she’s “incredibly grateful” to the community for their support and for investing in the next generation of athletes.

“This town never fails to surprise me. They’ve come together countless times before to support me through two Olympic cycles, and now they’re coming through again to help create a training location for me in the very park where I first practiced. It’s been incredible to see the impact athletics has had on our community, starting with the completion of the track at the high school,” she said in an emailed statement to the Bulletin.

“Being able to be part of the rejuvenation of Brooklyn Park is really special to me. By creating another space where people of all ages can come to throw, try the sport I love, and experience the opportunities it can create means so much. This sport has taken me to the world stage, and I’m so excited to help create a place where others can dis-

cover that same passion.” Smale says they’ve already discussed the project with some local companies willing to help out, including Chad Bowers of Bowers Concrete, who has worked with Mitton on another shot put pad. They’ve also been contacted by Sport Nova Scotia, who has offered advice on grant funding.

“So other organizations that have supported Sarah throughout the growth of her career are now reaching out to help support us, support her.”

She says they plan to finish it by September. “We are waiting for Sarah to come back in the next couple weeks. She’s working with her coach on

getting the specific parameters of what she needs.” The new shot put landing won’t just be for Mitton. It will also be open to other athletes from the community and beyond. Smale says they’ve already heard from a Special Olympian in Bridgewater who’s interested in training there.

“We have other Olympic athletes on the South Shore who are going, “This is amazing.”

Smale says Mitton has told them she’ll also help with fundraising efforts and youth clinics.

The group is considering having rental equipment available for community members to try their hands, and arms, at shot put.

“It’s just more of what can we add on to it to make it more of a community facility? And then, reaching back out to the community and saying, what could we use this for in the off-time? Like the kids can rollerblade on it. We’ve talked about setting up an outdoor shuffleboard. You know, what other purposes can we use it for when it’s not in use for professional practice?”

To make all that happen, the association has created sponsorship packages, up to \$7,500. People interested in supporting the project can email brooklynrecommittee@gmail.com.

“We’re in the early parts of it, and we’re going to want to make a quick move on this to make sure that Sarah can feel comfortable practising in her hometown,” Smale says.

“There’s nothing that makes us feel better than supporting our own hometown hero.”

Staff shortages reason for Canada Post delays

The ongoing complaints also left the *Bulletin* looking for an explanation for why deliveries were failing, even though there had been an earlier indication that local routes were running as usual.

On Aug. 11, Canada Post provided an updated explanation via e-mail statement, admitting that delays to the *South Shore Bulletin* were happening.

“We are aware that we’ve had delays with delivery of the *South Shore Bulletin*,” said Geneviève Joly, a Canada Post public relations representative. “We understand the importance of the postal services we provide to the community of Bridgewater, and we take that very seriously.”

Joly said the delays are happening because of staffing shortages that are affecting mail delivery in the area.

“Unfortunately, we are currently experiencing staffing shortages, which has impacted the delivery of mail including the *South Shore Bulletin*,” she said.

Canada Post has started hiring temporary employ-

ees in an effort to improve service. “We have started the hiring process for temporary employees and hope to improve service soon,” Joly said.

The company apologized to affected customers and readers.

“We apologize to our Bridgewater customers and to *South Shore Bulletin* readers for this temporary inconvenience and thank them for their patience as we work through this issue.”

The explanation gives a reason for the ongoing delivery problems but comes after weeks of complaints from subscribers and an earlier response saying there were no reported service disruptions in the area.

For the *Bulletin*, the inconsistent deliveries have also created uncertainty for readers who depend on the newspaper to get local news and community information each week.

Canada Post said customers with questions about their postal services can contact its customer service team online or by telephone.

Lockeport sea derby a monster success

LOCKEPORT – A lot of big fish came out of the water at the 34th annual Lockeport Sea Derby, Nova Scotia’s longest running fishing derby, held Aug. 7-9.

The 457 fishers fought through a wall of fog that stayed around most of the weekend, before clearing up near the end of the tournament. On the plus side, the water was extremely calm making for some great fishing conditions.

“It went really well. I think it is the second biggest turnout that we’ve had,” said derby President George Benham, who added that 82 of the fishers were in the youth category.

“There were a lot of fish caught, a lot of nice mackerel around, some good cod

fish. I think everybody really enjoyed themselves.”

The derby, now Nova Scotia’s longest running sea derby, started in 1992 (one year was missed due to COVID-19.)

Benham explained that in 1992, the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) started up several derbies around the province, but within a few years turned them over to local communities to keep them going.

Not only has the Lockeport event continued, but it is thriving with more fishers and more sponsorship from businesses in the area.

“Some dropped out, but we’ve kept ours going, and the last six or seven years we’ve been growing. We’re getting bigger and better all the time,” he said. “Next year is our 35th and we hope to keep growing the derby. Our sponsors

have really upped their game, and we’ve really received great support from the community.”

One of the major sponsors, and there are many, include R. Baker Fisheries Ltd. (1975) who opens their wharf up for the derby each year and supplies all the ice and the fish boxes for them to use.

Thanks to the great support, the committee was able to give out more than \$25,000 in cash and prizes including \$5,000 for the adult grand prize and \$500 for the youth grand prize.

The top three largest adult mackerel and ground fish receive prizes; the top five largest mackerel and ground fish for the youth (ages 5-15) get prizes and the top three, under-five youth receive prizes for the largest mackerel catches.

Plus, every participating youth re-

ceives a prize for being a part of the event.

The tournament, which is kept family-friendly, has been made into a must-attend weekend with several families planning their vacation around it each year.

“We get people from Ottawa each year; P.E.I. and New Brunswick who plan their vacation around the derby every year,” said Benham. “This year, the youth winner was from Ottawa, and he had not been here before, he said he couldn’t believe his experience and ‘I would do this again so quick. I hope we come back again next year.’”

SHELBURNE COUNTY – Nominations are now open for the 2026 Shelburne County Business Excellence awards.

Harris said that winning an award means a lot to those businesses.

“I think that any business chosen by the people would be important for them,” said Harris.

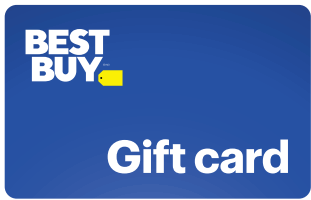

The animals you don't see:
What happens behind the shelter doors

When you see an animal listed for adoption, you're seeing the part of shelter life that happens after a great deal of work has already taken place.

At SHAID Tree Animal Shelter, every animal that arrives begins a journey of assessment, medical care, daily care and preparation before they are ready to find their forever home.

The process starts with an intake examination. Staff assess each animal's overall health and look for injuries, illness, parasites and other medical concerns. Animals receive necessary vaccinations, parasite treatments, veterinary care and medications and cats and dogs are spayed or neutered before adoption unless there is a specific reason they cannot be.

But preparing an animal for adoption involves much more than veterinary care.

Staff and volunteers spend time getting to know each animal's personality and needs. Is a cat shy or outgoing? Does a dog enjoy other animals? Would an animal prefer a quiet household? Does a particular pet need a feline companion, or would they be happiest as the only animal?

Royal and Noble, a bonded pair currently looking for their forever home together, are a perfect example.

Noble is a gentle, quiet boy who can take some time to feel comfortable in new surroundings. Royal

is a sweet, long-haired girl with a calm and graceful personality. The two have formed a close bond and provide comfort and confidence for one another. Because of that relationship, their ideal home isn't simply one that wants a cat – it needs to be a home willing to welcome both of them and allow their bond to continue.

Understanding details like these takes time and observation. It happens through the countless hours staff and volunteers spend caring for, socializing, and getting to know the animals.

And then there is the daily work that never stops. Every animal needs fresh food and water, clean

bedding, clean living spaces, litter boxes maintained, laundry washed and regular enrichment. Cats need opportunities to play, climb, scratch, explore, and relax. Shy animals may need quiet companionship and gentle encouragement before they are ready to trust people.

Some animals require even more time. They may arrive sick, injured, frightened, or simply overwhelmed. They may spend days or weeks receiving care and building confidence before they're ready to appear on an adoption page.

Much of this work happens quietly, behind closed doors, but it is what makes successful adoptions possible.

And SHAID couldn't do it alone. Shelter staff, volunteers, foster families, veterinary professionals, donors, adopters and community supporters all play a role. From cleaning kennels and washing dishes to providing medical care and paying for essential supplies, every contribution helps create another second chance.

So, when you see a photograph of an animal waiting for a home, remember that you're seeing only a small part of their story.

You may see Royal and Noble looking for a family, but behind that photo are countless meals, clean litter boxes, veterinary appointments, moments of socialization, careful observations, and people who have taken the time to understand who they are.

Behind every adoption is a team. Behind every animal is a story. And behind every second chance is a community that cared enough to make it possible.

Problems, questions and distractions

We can't know for certain what life will bring to us from one day to the next. Perhaps it will be joy and satisfaction. I hope so. However, it's likely that sooner or later, every one of us will encounter some difficulties along the way.

When that happens, sharing those difficulties can help to reduce the pain. Have a conversation; talk about it.

However, you may have already experienced the reality that some of those conversations help; others don't. A conversation about problems could bring us closer together or it could drive us further apart. Dr. Bob Wubbolding addresses the second possibility as he writes, "When someone dumps his or her problems on you..."

You may have had the experience where you perceive that someone has "dumped" their problems on you. The end result of that dumping may be even more frustration for both of you. What could we do that might make that conversation more helpful?

In "A Set of Direction for Putting and Keeping

Yourself Together," Dr. Bob says that it's important to remember to talk about possible solutions when we talk about problems.

Continuing the quote, he writes, "When someone dumps his or her problems on you, listen politely for a while, then ask..."

Listening is important. However, active listening is also curious. It engages. It asks questions. And there are many questions that could be useful.

Last column, I mentioned, "Would you like a suggestion?" (A question that's useful in so many situations; not just for problems.) You might also ask, "What could you do that would help the situation?"

A few more questions oriented toward problem-solving are: "What would you like to see happen?" "Can you work it out?" "Do you have a way of handling it?" "Can you think of someone knowledgeable who could help you?"

Depending on the situation, a different type of question might also be helpful. Here it is, from Dr. Bob, "How will you take your mind off the problem for a while?"

On Aug. 6 Bette Veinotte was visiting her family cottage in Green Bay and saw 60 sanderlings.

As of Aug. 8, Mark Dennis reported that there still was a yellow-crowned night heron at Newellton on Cape Sable Island. On Aug. 11 Barbara McLean saw an alder flycatcher at Shoreline Drive in Blue Rocks. The next day a brown pelican showed up in Shelburne Harbour.

Going forward I'll make a note when I mention Crescent Beach as being in Lunenburg County or Shelburne County. If any of you do have reports for me of Crescent Beach in Lockeport please do contact me.

I did not get chance to bird much over the past week as I was busy looking after performers during the Lunenburg Folk Harbour Festival. I look after around-town transport when the performers are here.

Usually during the festival I see lots of migrants passing over Blockhouse Hill where the main stage tent is. This is the first year in the last 39 that I did not see this happen. I don't really know what this means.

Did the migrants go through earlier than normal

or are they late or have they changed their flight path this year? I did see 80 common grackles migrating through at Mason's Beach one night. Susan Wile spotted a Swainson's Thrush at her mother's place at Oxner's Beach.

On Aug. 9, JD Bharvad located a black-necked stilt at Dominion Beach in Cape Breton. A Mississippi kite was posted at Reserve Mines in Cape Breton. While looking for the kite, JD Bharvad had a sandhill crane fly by.

David Currie found a great egret at Rainbow Haven. Logan LaLonde spotted two Virginia rails, two soras and 100 common night hawks at the French Basin Trail. As of Aug. 10, a white ibis was still tending at Glace Bay, Cape Breton.

Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop spotted an immature, yellow-crowned night heron at Dyke Road in Grand Desert. Sarah Foote sighted a Caspian tern at the guzzle in the valley. Hillary Mann, while doing a survey on the semi-palmated sandpipers reported 90,000 in Cheverie and 600,000 in the upper Bay of Fundy.

On Aug. 11 Rick Brown saw an American golden plover with 50 black-bellied plovers at Chebogue Point. He also had a solitary sandpiper at Egypt Road in Yarmouth and he also reported four great egrets at Churn Road in Yarmouth. Kathleen MacAulay found a dunlin at Cape Forchu. Jake Chute spotted a Caspian tern at Port George.

You don't get to write your own reputation

Twenty some years ago, I stood in a walk-in cooler for a minute longer than I needed to, because I could hear two of my team talking on the other side of the door and they didn't know I was there. What they said about me in that moment was truer than anything I'd told them in a pre-shift coffee talk all year.

I've never forgotten it, because it taught me things I now build my practice around: you can talk about the kind of leader you are all day long, but you don't get to decide whether it's true.

A friend shared a post online this week that pulled me right back to that cooler. It stopped my

scroll because it's basically the earned media version of a question that I ask leaders all the time, would you want to work for you?

The argument was simple: earned media, what others say about your business, is a distribution channel, not a brand exercise. When a traveller asks AI, Google, or any review platform where to stay, the answer comes from what's been published about you, not what you published about yourself.

That isn't just a hospitality truth, it's valuable to a business in any sector and it applies just as much to towns and communities working to attract investment, talent, and pride. Nobody invests, relocates, or roots down because of a slogan. They come because of what other people are already saying.

Here's where it got personal for me. Your leader-

ship brand works exactly the same way, you don't get to write it. Your team publishes your brand for you every day, in what they say when you're not in the room. It happens when the team gathers, at work or away from it, when a candidate asks whether they'd want to work for you, when a team member decides whether to stay.

It happens in how they talk in the drive-through line picking up their morning coffee and when someone weighs a referral. The answer doesn't come from your one big team speech or your polished online presence.

It comes from your earned media in the exit interview, the parking-lot conversation, the way you responded when things went sideways and when they didn't, the tone of your voice when someone called out and what someone tells their family over dinner about how they were treated today.

The marketing world argues about PR and that reputation isn't a soft nice-to-have. It's your talent channel, the thing that quietly fills your pipeline or quietly drains it and it's usually the last thing a busy leader ever actually measures.

So here's your work this week. It takes just 10 minutes.

First, write down three things you'd want your team to say about you when you're not in the room. That's your desired earned media.

Second, next to each one, name the last specific moment you actually gave them a reason to say it. Not a policy. Not an intention. A moment.

Third, the gaps are your week's work.

That's the whole exercise.

Desired reputation minus real evidence equals your leadership to-do list, every single time.

You'll never get to write your own reputation. But you get to earn it, in the next conversation, in the next thing you do when you think no one's paying attention.

Somebody always is. Make it worth repeating.

In the late 1940’s she was runner-up in the Queen of the Sea pageant during Lunenburg’s Fisheries Exhibition. She loved her animals as a child - various ducks and rabbits and especially her dog Buster.

In 1951 mom married Frederick John Creaser of Riverport and they went on to have 6 children. She kept us busy in dance, figure skating, hockey, skiing, boating, horseback riding, tennis, swimming, camping and gardening. She was forever sewing costumes for performances and Halloween. To this day we all love a great costume. Lol

Through her years she taught skating, took tap dancing, was a curler & golfer, became a Bridge Master (it was a rare night that she did not come home with a prize), car enthusiast (sports cars were a thing) and in later years she took up painting. Mom instilled a sense of giving to any community that you joined. She volunteered at the Bonny Lea Farm’s Lobster suppers, NS Rehabilitation Centre, Aspotogan Arts Centre, Friends of the Citadel, and St John’s Anglican Church Chancel Guild, and one of her proudest moments was bringing the RCMP Musical Ride to Chester. One gift she passed along to all of us was a sense of design and renovation which all six of us have carried on in one form or another, along with a rather nomadic lifestyle as we took on various projects.

“Mumsie” as we’ve come to call her of late, had a real joie de vivre for life, joining her many friends & family in social gatherings over the decades. Hard working in everything she approached puts it mildly. She weeded, we weeded. She raked, we raked. And so on. The number of turkey, lobster & salmon feasts for countless people who were ever showing up was beyond measure. Apple pies, chocolate chip cookies, lemon loaves, brownies, apple dumplings, Kim cookies, and certainly a million pancakes were always rolling out of the kitchen. All of this was done with her sense of current fashion intact, typically dressed to the nines.

Mom is survived by her six children - Faune Creaser (Alex Astbury), Stewart Creaser (Lorraine Vassalo), Susan Creaser (Warren Steele), George Creaser (Karn Nichols), Janet Creaser-Burgess and Jonathan Creaser (Jenna Creaser), various nieces & nephews, ten grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.

She was predeceased by her husband, Fred, her parents, Harry & Vera Fulton, grandparents Anna & Harry Cameron and Eva & Hiram Fulton, her brother Cyril Edgar Fulton, her aunts Irene Abigail (Cameron) Christensen & Helen (Fulton) Ripley, as well as a dear uncle, Giles Grant Cameron. What do you think of that? Does it strike you as putting it off? Nothing gets solved by avoiding, does it? Well, let's think about that. First, is anything getting solved by complaining? Probably not, or it wouldn't still be a problem. And we know that continuing to do the thing that isn't working likely isn't helping.

Another important issue is that some problems are not solvable, or at least, they are not solvable now. Time may not heal all wounds, but time can provide an opportunity for changes to happen.

There are many things that we can't control. For example, you have probably learned, as I have, that when you have an injury, some actions don't help. Sometimes we just have to sit quietly and wait. Patience can indeed be a virtue.

Maybe it's time to suggest trying something different. Take a break from the nagging problem. Pull back. See what happens.

Distractions have value. It'll be no surprise that I'll suggest that we choose positive, productive activities as our distractions, rather than passive or even destructive actions. I don't perceive Dr. Bob

to be a bossy type of guy, but even he states, "Turn off the TV." I would add social media scrolling to that "turn off" suggestion.

We can't expect that every conversation will be a gratifying problem-solving experience. We can offer suggestions; we can ask questions. And sometimes, the useful suggestion for an action to take may be, in a sense, no action at all. Maybe it's time for a little break, especially one that brings good cheer and draws people closer.
