Not chicken feed:

Queens land use review stirs up concerns about enforcement, Airbnbs, livestock

LIVERPOOL – New rules about what people can do with their properties are welcome, but they don't mean much if the municipality doesn't enforce them, some Queens County residents said at the first of five public meetings on private land use rules.

"It's really great that we're going to move around chairs on the Titanic, but we're still going in the same direction," local business owner Keith McDonnell told a consultant with UPLAND Planning and Design Studio from Halifax, the firm hired to lead the Region of Queens review of its land use bylaw and municipal planning strategy.

About 20 people turned out for the

session at Queens Place Emera Centre on June 23.

McDonnell and others said the region needs to do a better job of making sure people follow the rules.

His wife, Denaige McDonnell, suggested that some kind of regular auditing should be part of the bylaw so that there's better accountability for how complaints are handled by municipal staff.

Senior planner Ian Watson, who was leading the session, said UPLAND's advice to local governments for any new bylaws or changes is to make sure they are willing and able to enforce them.

Councillors voted in December to hire UPLAND Planning and Design Studio of Halifax to lead the review. They've set aside \$50,000 for the process.

The region's land use bylaw and municipal planning strategy were overhauled

in 2022, which was also overseen by UPLAND.

The bylaw was under scrutiny recently, as councillors changed it to allow the re-development of the old Stedmans building on Main Street in Liverpool into mostly apartments with commercial space.

The region wants UPLAND to look at commercial uses in residential zones, short-term rentals, livestock in residential and rural zones, light pollution, coastal protection, and minimum property standards.

Some people at the Queens Place session said they're worried about a proliferation of short-term rentals, owned by non-residents, in some areas. They said that leaving houses empty or having people constantly move in and out of them erodes that sense of neighbourhood.

There are 133 properties in Queens County registered as short-term rentals.

“We are focusing on tourism income at the cost of our community,” one woman said.

Stone Altman of Western Head said it’s important to distinguish between those owned by

residents and those owned by non-residents. He said the overall bylaw review is important.

“I think there needs to be thought put towards what we want to see happen in this area, of what we want our community to be and to become,” he said after the meeting.

“What do we want to create? And then what do we have to do to create that?”

What do we have to do to attract those people, to attract different businesses, more businesses, develop the community. I guess I want to have more confidence that that’s being done.”

Small-scale agriculture became a flashpoint the last time the bylaw was overhauled.

Concerns persist among some residents that the region may try to clamp down on how many animals someone can raise for their own use.

Ange Dean, who led some of the campaign last time to allow more flexibility for homeowners, said it’s important for people to give their input.

“It’s really important to come out, and it’s important for the region to have other ways of connecting with people,” she said. “Maybe they should have someone at Privateer Days with this setup, just so people wandering around can come and give

their opinion. I think that would be a great way to connect with people.”

Lunenburg District RCMP charges a man and woman after responding to an assault in progress

HEBBVILLE - Lunenburg District RCMP has charged a man with multiple offences and a woman for obstructing officers after responding to an assault in progress in Hebbville.

On May 27, at approximately 6:40 a.m., Lunenburg District RCMP received a report that a man had assaulted a woman outside a home on Conquerall Mills Rd. then forced her inside the residence.

Upon arrival, officers immediately entered the home and located a woman not believed to be involved in the assault. The woman refuted officers’ belief that another woman and man were inside the home and actively attempted to obstruct officers trying to find the victim and suspect. The woman was safely removed from the residence as officers continued to search inside.

Officers then located the victim with non-life-threatening injuries and safely removed her from the residence. A short time later, they found and arrested a

man who was hiding inside the home. The victim was transported to hospital by EHS and offered the support of RCMP Victim Services.

Tyler Michael Drennan, 35, of Hebbville, has been charged with: kidnapping, forcible confinement; assault; assault by choking; failure to comply with order (2x); failure to comply with an appearance notice.

On June 7, officers charged Anna Louise Maughan, 61, of Hebbville, with Obstructing a Peace Officer.

Drennan was remanded into custody pending a future court appearance.

Maughan was released on conditions and is scheduled to appear in Bridgewater Provincial Court on July 2.

With the victim’s support, investigators can confirm this was an incident of intimate partner violence.

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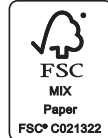

So much for all my hard work. So much for trying to make people feel a little brighter when they drive or walk by, enjoying the sight. The poppies are gone and will not be coming back.

Early cancer screening matters - your story does too

June was National Cancer Survivors Month — a time to honour the courage and resilience shown by cancer patients and their families, and to focus on the work ahead. For me, that work includes advocating for earlier colon cancer screening. I was diagnosed at 48, two years before I would have been eligible for routine screening in Nova Scotia. Like so many others, I was young, active, and had no family history. Colon cancer wasn't even on my radar until it changed my life.

That's why I'm encouraged by the momentum we're seeing across Canada when it comes to lowering the age of screening. In March, during Colon Cancer Awareness Month, Prince Edward Island became the first province in the country to lower the screening age from 50 to 45.

It was a significant step — one backed by the Canadian Cancer Society, which just weeks earlier had taken a stance encouraging all provinces and territories to make the same change. Ontario has since announced it will follow suit effective July 1. These decisions mean catching more cancer cases earlier, when they are most treatable.

Colorectal cancer is one of the most commonly diagnosed cancers in Canada. It's also the second leading cause of cancer related death behind lung cancer. The data is clear: more people under 50 are being diagnosed with colon cancer, and home screening kits can detect cancer before symptoms appear. Our screening programs must reflect today's reality.

There have been important conversations taking place here in Atlantic Canada, with health leaders, advocates, and organizations discussing the need for earlier screening across the region. I appreciate that it isn't as simple as lowering the age. Change takes planning, resources, and political will — but other jurisdictions have shown it can be done. I applaud all involved in these discussions and encourage decision makers here in Nova Scotia to be the next to take that step. Early detection saves lives.

Jane’s Place working to provide safe harbour for survivors of domestic violence

LIVERPOOL – Plans are under way for a feasibility study for one of the South Shore’s only second-stage housing developments for families fleeing domestic violence.

Jane’s Place Society is working to create safe, secure housing for people and their children in Queens County who are leaving emergency shelters, but still need support to live on their own.

Since the group formed about a year ago, volunteers have met with community members, politicians from all levels of government, the Queens General Hospital Foundation and other organizations.

Chairwoman Deborah Herman-Spartinelli says the group has letters of support from various individuals and groups.

And they’ve been looking at properties that would be appropriate for second-stage housing. She says they hope to be able to buy something in the Liverpool area in the new year.

“We are exploring development opportunities, funding sources,” she says. “Also just trying to collaborate with other organizations that will help support our safe housing. So, we’re trying to look at the long term and how we can support this endeavour with sources of income.”

The Nova Scotia government declared intimate partner violence an epidemic in September 2025 and increased funding to transition houses across the province.

The Transition House Association of Nova Scotia says that in 2024 its member organizations supported about 4,500 women and children in abusive situations. It says the problem is only getting worse.

Officials with the South Shore Transition House Association have said there’s a critical need for second-stage housing on the South Shore.

Herman-Spartinelli says that to access much of the funding available, the group needs to conduct a feasibility study to forecast how much the project could cost.

They’re speaking with four different companies now with experience in second-stage housing to decide which one is best to do that study.

She says after that is done, Jane’s Place will be in a better position to apply for government and private funding.

“And so if you’re in that position of leaving a transition house and you’ve had two incomes or just your spouse’s income, it’s very important to be able to have something that you can afford to take your children and yourself to live until you can strengthen your financial and emotional state, and also have support services in place, everything that’s needed to support women to become independent again.”

Jane’s Place is named in memory of Jane Hurshman, the Queens County woman convicted of killing her abusive ex-husband in 1982. Some of the people involved in Jane’s Place, including Herman-Spartinelli, were friends of Hurshman.

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BBQ ShishKabobs

(Serves 4-6)

INGREDIENTS FOR THE KABOBS

- 1½-2 lbs chicken breast
- 1 red bell pepper, cut into chunks
- 1 new potato cut in half if necessary
- 1 red onion, cut into wedges
- 1 small zucchini, sliced thick
- 1 cup mushrooms (whole or halved)
- Wooden or metal skewers (if wooden, soak 30 minutes)

MARINADE

- ¼ cup olive oil
- 3 tbsp soy sauce
- 2 tbsp lemon juice (or red wine vinegar)
- 2 tbsp honey or brown sugar
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- ½ tsp black pepper
- ½ tsp salt

PREPARATION

1. Marinate the meat
2. Whisk all marinade ingredients in a bowl.
3. Add meat and toss to coat.
4. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour (4-6 hours gives deeper flavour).
5. Prep the veggies
6. Keep pieces roughly the same size so they cook evenly.
7. Lightly toss veggies in a splash of oil, salt, and pepper.
8. Build the kabobs
9. Alternate: meat, pepper, onion, zucchini, potato and mushroom, repeating until skewers are full.
10. Grill
11. Preheat BBQ to mediumhigh.
12. Grill skewers 10-12 minutes, turning every 2-3 minutes.
13. Brush with leftover marinade during the first half of cooking only.
14. Cook until meat is done and veggies have a little char.

Great with rice or grilled pita, tzatziki or garlic yogurt sauce, a squeeze of lemon, fresh parsley on top

The restaurant gives diners a traditional South Shore seafood experience. The menu is inspired by local favourites, along with family recipes including pasta, chicken, pork tenderloin and steak.

Lobster lovers can indulge in Hot Lobster Rolls, Hot Lobster Sandwiches or Market Priced Steamed Lobster Dinner with a side or two, often at an unbelievable price of \$45. The Seafood Chowder contains a generous portion of lobster too.

Never burn a bridge:

What good leadership looks like when nobody’s watching

Eight months ago, I sat across from a candidate for 15 minutes. It was a screening interview, part of retainer work I do for a client in the construction industry, nothing to do with hospitality at all. The role wasn’t a fit, but the conversation was good. She was sharp, grounded, and clearly someone who took her career seriously.

Last week, I found out she’s stepped into a key leadership role at a hospitality business right here in my community.

And without a second of hesitation, I sent her a note of congratulations.

Here’s why that matters, and why it almost never happens the way you’d think.

That 15-minute conversation didn’t end the way most candidate conversations end in this industry, with silence. It ended with a follow up. Because of the leadership processes put in place with that client, she wasn’t left wondering. She was told, clearly and respectfully, that the role had gone in a different direction. The process had a period at the end of the sentence, not a trailing ellipsis.

That’s it. That’s the whole story. She was treated like a human being who deserved an answer.

And because of that, eight months later, I could write to her, not as someone hoping she’d forgotten how things ended but as someone who knew exact-

ly how things ended and knew it reflected well on everyone involved.

I think about this a lot, especially as AI tools increasingly process applications before a human ever sees them. Efficiency is not the enemy but efficiency without follow through is how good people quietly disappear from a process and how businesses quietly build a reputation they don’t even know they have.

Here’s the part our industry doesn’t say enough: you are marketing to your team the same way you market to your guests. Every candidate interaction, whether it ends in a job offer or a polite no, is a brand impression.

Word travels in community faster than any job posting. The way you closed the loop with someone eight months ago is exactly the kind of thing that surfaces eight months later, when you least expect it and most need it.

We keep saying nobody wants to work. I’d push back on that, gently but firmly. Experienced, capable people are out there. What they remember, what they tell their friends, their former colleagues, their next employer is how they were treated when they didn’t get the job.

Do the right thing when there’s nothing in it for you. Follow up. Close the loop. Leave the door open, even when you’re the one closing it.

You never know who’s going to be running the place down the street in eight months.

What your adoption fee really pays for:

Understanding the costs behind giving shelter animals a second chance

One of the questions animal shelters hear most often is, “Why is there an adoption fee?”

For many people, the answer may not be obvious. After all, the goal of a shelter is to find loving homes for animals in need. But behind every adoption is a significant investment of time, care, and veterinary treatment that helps ensure animals are healthy, safe, and ready for their new families.

At SHAID Tree Animal Shelter, every cat and dog receives comprehensive care before being made available for adoption. While adoption fees help offset some of these expenses, they rarely cover the full cost of caring for an animal during their stay.

For cats, veterinary care begins with a thorough health examination. Animals are vaccinated, microchipped, spayed or neutered, treated for fleas and parasites, tested for Felv/FIV, and monitored for any health concerns. Many arrive requiring additional treatment for injuries, illnesses, infections, or dental issues.

Dogs require similar veterinary care, including vaccinations, microchips, spay or neuter surgery, parasite prevention and health assessments. Some animals also need behavioural support, specialized diets, or extended medical treatment before they are ready for adoption.

Beyond veterinary expenses, shelters provide

food, litter, bedding, cleaning supplies, enrichment toys, housing, and daily care. Staff and volunteers spend countless hours feeding, cleaning, socializing, monitoring health and helping animals learn to trust people again after difficult circumstances.

One of the many animals currently benefiting from that care is Chilean, a one-year-old tabby who is SHAID’s longest-term feline resident. Chilean arrived at the shelter in need of a safe place to land and has since received all the care necessary to prepare her for adoption. While she remains a little shy, shelter staff know there is a sweet and loving cat waiting to emerge once she finds the right home.

Like many long-term residents, Chilean’s challenge isn’t a lack of potential, it’s simply finding the perfect match. She would thrive in a patient household and would especially benefit from having a friendly feline companion to help build her confidence as she adjusts to life in a new home.

Stories like Chilean’s are a reminder that adoption fees represent much more than the cost of bringing home a pet. They help support the medical care, shelter, nutrition, and daily attention that give animals a second chance at life.

When someone chooses to adopt, they are not only gaining a companion, but they are also helping make room for the next animal in need. Their adoption fee becomes part of a cycle of care that allows shelters to continue rescuing, rehabilitating, and rehoming homeless animals in our community.

Every adoption changes at least two lives: the pet going home and the one who can now take its place at the shelter.

As shelters across the province continue to face rising veterinary and operating costs, community support remains more important than ever. Whether through adoption, volunteering, fostering, or donations, every contribution helps ensure that animals like Chilean receive the care they need while they wait for the loving homes they deserve.

If you’ve been considering adding a feline companion to your family, perhaps Chilean is the cat you’ve been waiting for.

According to Choice Theory, we have basic needs, and much of what we do is an attempt to satisfy those needs. Some actions are effective; others not so much. Most of the time, we likely don’t think of needs as the driver behind our decisions.

However, there is real, practical value to being aware of those needs. For example, if you’ve ever wondered, “Why did I do that?” then you know that having a way to understand human behaviour, even our own behaviour, could be useful!

Recently, I’ve been examining our basic needs from the perspective of looking at what we want. What would satisfy those needs? Previously, I’ve

looked at freedom, fun, and power/recognition. This time the question is, “What do you want when it comes to love and belonging?”

You don’t need a lot of life experience to realize that different people want different levels of connection with others. There are at least some of us who would happily live in an Alaskan cabin, only emerging a few times a year for flour and salt.

Then there are the folks who want constant interaction. In their perception, an hour alone is an hour wasted or worse. Constant contact is now more possible than ever, as even when you can’t have face-to-face contact, there is the option of constant virtual contact by phone, text and social media.

Somewhere between those extremes you’ll find the rest of us. What do we want?

In some cases, our wants can simply not be satisfied as we would like them to be. We may want the companionship of someone who is no longer with us. We may want the love of someone who has no interest in loving us. Those are hard realities to accept. The best I can do here is to suggest that we look for other ways, other people, to help us to satisfy the need. We both know this is hardly an ideal answer. But it may be a realistic one.

If you do happen to have the love and belonging

in your life that satisfies you, then I suggest that you cherish it. Guard it. Appreciate it. You could even tell the people who give you this sense of satisfaction that you appreciate them. It’s surprising how helpful that can be!

Through our experiences, some of us have learned a disturbing lesson: it can be easier to destroy a relationship than to create one.

My suggestion this time may only apply to a few people; it’s for anyone who had a relationship that was once good but has now grown cold. Perhaps it doesn’t exist at all, because of disputes, misunderstandings or simple neglect.

What to do? Consider reaching out. See what happens.

There’s the possibility that your initiative will be ignored. It might even be rejected, perhaps in a nasty, ungracious way. People can be like that.

On the other hand, they may be delighted to hear from you. It may restart a once-good relationship and transform it into a deeper, more mature one. I don’t know what will happen. But either way, you will have learned something.

So much of Choice Theory is about relationships. How can we get along with other people? A Choice Theory mindset promotes using caring habits that bring people together, rather than destructive habits that drive us apart.

Relationships can be messy. They can be annoying. But they can also be tremendously fulfilling, bringing us learning, freedom, fun, and security.

Adventures in birding

Dorothy Poole and I set out on June 14 to do my yearly Breeding Bird Monitoring Route, which starts at Jordan Falls goes into Shelburne and then up into Welshtown.

It is not a pleasant day of birding as we need to be at the start of the route by 5 a.m. We then do 50 designated stops for three minutes each. We record all birds that we see and hear at each stop.

We are supposed to be done by 11 a.m. so it is fast paced. Normally on this route we find 60-70 species of birds. This year we only hit 48 species.

Looking at the route historically, back into the 1970s there were a lot of species that we are no longer seeing. This likely is due to habitat change over the years. I am now seeing a lot of species that were not seen back then. Again, a change in habitat I'm assuming.

On June 20 I set off for my nephew's wedding near Moncton in New Brunswick. I figured that on this weekend, I might have time to hit up a few spots along the way and back that I've found special birds at over the years. It was vastly disappointing.

The first spot I checked was in Folly Mountain where I over the years always found Lincoln's sparrow and mourning warbler. It was not to be this year. Over the past three years I was unable to make this trip there and I found that the habitat had modified with everything grown up a lot. Therefore, I did not find the Lincoln's sparrow nor the mourning warbler.

On the way back on Sunday, I stopped at the Sackville Waterfowl Park in New Brunswick. I saw lots of pied-billed grebes there. A new bird for the year, but I was hopeful in seeing one in Nova Scotia at the Amherst Point Bird Sanctuary. I'm getting ahead of myself though.

My next stop was at the Eddy Marsh where a least bittern was both being seen and heard. When I reached the start of the Eddy Road on the New Brunswick side there was a sign saying Road Closed. I noticed a truck drive in so I followed.

The truck stopped and I spoke with a couple who told me that I would have no issues getting through the road. It had been flooded, but water levels had dropped back and there was no longer any water in the road. The sign was left in place as ATVs had been abusive to the road.

I reached the spot for the least bittern, but had no luck. I had heard marsh wrens before but had not seen one. I got lucky and did spot one of these birds, but just briefly, so no photos.

Next, I went to the Amherst Point Bird Sanctuary with hopes of getting a Virginia Rail and seeing black terns. One used to be able to take the trail into the marsh area and walk around to the other side and to view both areas of the marsh.

This is where I always got the Virginia Rail and also where I would see the black terns. During the last major storm, I found out that they totally re-routed the trail and that we no longer have access to the marsh itself.

A vast disappointment after the long hike in with only a small look at the marsh. There is a small area where one can view the marsh from the main road, so I checked there. I did hear three sora rails and saw one briefly. A highlight there for me was a flyover of an American bittern, which was a bird that I missed altogether last year.

I had hoped to see pied-billed grebes, but I did not. I also had planned on getting this species at the French Basin Trail and at Miner's Marsh previously in the year and did not.

Avery Nagy-MacArthur located a scissor-tailed flycatcher at Crows Neck Beach on June 19. Dorthy Poole and I set off on June 22 to try and see this bird. By the time we arrived at the beach it was very foggy and windy. I might have briefly seen the bird, but was on the phone at the time.

By the time I hung up the phone and went to get a better look, the bird I saw was gone and did not reappear. So, my sighting was not good enough to record it as having been seen. I did not have arctic tern for the year and there are a number of these

terns breeding at Crows Neck Beach so I was happy to see them. We did find a thick-billed murre in close to the road near Summerville Beach.

On June 18 Logan Moore reported a dovekie off Port Mouton Island. On June 19 Andrew Bates spotted an American pipit at Beach Meadows Beach. This is an unusual time of year for seeing this species. On June 24 Ethan Sarty sighted two chimney swifts above the Emera Centre in Liverpool. Kevin Lantz found a great-crested flycatcher in Cookville.

Rarer species across the province were a white ibis in Glace Bay, Cape Breton. Other birds in Cape Breton are American oystercatcher, Philadelphia vireo and a great egret. Halifax County birds consisted of little blue heron, green heron and pied-billed grebe.

Other sightings included: Northeast Mainland, a northern mockingbird; Northwest Mainland, an eastern meadowlark; and Southwest Nova Scotia, a laughing gull, willow flycatcher, American oystercatchers, and a brown thrasher. The Valley produced wood thrush and great-crested flycatcher.

On June 19 Kathleen MacAulay did a three hour seawatch at Cape Forchu and saw one Pomarine jaeger, nine Atlantic puffins, two black guillemots, six razorbills, one common murre, 12 American herring gulls, 25 great black-backed gulls, two common loons, two Wilson's storm petrels, 17 northern fulmars, 15 greater shearwaters, 1,706 sooty shearwaters, 68 Manx shearwaters and 323 northern gannets.

LIVERPOOL – Queens County businesses have another way to connect with their customers and attract new ones.

Tap and Go Queens is a new members-only benefit offered by the South Queens Chamber of Commerce that literally puts local restaurants, shops, services and cultural sites on the map.

"It's a discovery tool," Suzanne Rushton, executive director of the chamber, said in an interview.

"The advantage is visibility, and also tracking. We are hoping to be able to track the number of visitors and people using the system. And so, we will be able to see how many hits each business gets using this program, which will be helpful to make decisions."

The chamber is slowly rolling it out, but about 100 businesses are already listed on the map. Businesses who are members of the North Queens Board of Trade are also eligible to participate.

Each business gets a decal with a unique QR code to display in its window or elsewhere. Visitors can scan the code on their phones to learn more about the business, visit its website or social media accounts and see any promotions or sales. People can also see other businesses in the area.

"So, it could be used for locals to look for accountants or services of some type or the laundromat, or tourists looking for shopping, restaurants, tourist sites," Rushton says.

The program was created by Nova Scotia-based Tapnbe. The Lunenburg Board of Trade has been using the app since 2024. In addition to listings for businesses, the Lunenburg map includes an art map and a heritage walking tour.

Rushton says that the advantage to Queens County is that people who have used it in Lunenburg will already be familiar with how it works when they visit downtown Liverpool.

Accessible washroom at Liverpool inclusive play park on tap for 2027

LIVERPOOL – A year-round, accessible washroom for the inclusive play park near Queens Place Emera Centre in Liverpool is expected to be built and operational by next year.

Adam Grant, Region of Queens infrastructure director, told councillors at their June 23 council meeting that the \$425,810 project should be ready in time for the 2027 season.

“We will work to complete the project within budget,” he said.

An accessible washroom for the seasonal Etli Milita’mk Universally Designed Play Park has been on the region’s radar since 2024 when coun-

cil supported District 4 Coun. Vicki Amirault’s request.

It’s been on hold as region staff tried to figure out a way to extend water, sewer and electricity to the area. The municipality has supplied a portable accessible toilet until the permanent facility is built.

The \$600,000 play park opened in October 2023, after a years-long community fundraising initiative by local members of Autism Nova Scotia. The region contributed the land and about \$112,000 to the project.

When the play park opened, the community wanted an accessible change room and washroom to com-

plement the playground and splash pad.

The washroom’s originally proposed location was 40 metres farther away and would have required trenching through the Queens Place parking lot and rendered the play park inaccessible during construction.

“This solution makes installation a lot simpler, easier to get services there, it doesn’t require asphalt trenching and it won’t require a wastewater pump station,” Grant told councillors.

The structure would be similar to the facilities at Beach Meadows Beach and contain two separate washrooms, with low-maintenance materials, change tables and doors that lock automatically after hours.

This option was the second-most expensive among the three choices available.

In response to a question from District 6 Coun. Stewart Jenkins, Grant said operating costs are “average amongst the three facilities (options) we have on there – just not a noteworthy amount”.

The region secured federal funding for the project through the Build Communities Strong Fund.

She says it’s one example of how the chamber is embracing innovation to help its members.

“We are using Lunenburg as an example. And there are additional features that can be rolled out once there’s more adoption of the program.”

Rushton says she hopes they can

eventually set up touch screen informational kiosks in areas like the Liverpool Visitor Information Centre that would include Tap and Go Queens.

But first, she says the chamber wants to make sure businesses are comfortable enough with the technology to encourage their customers to use it.

“So far, there’s been really a lot of enthusiasm for the project.”
